Colony Pooling Proposal of Labor ls Defeated In British House Of Commons

LONDON, Dec. 8: CP)- The House of Commons last night rejected by a vote of 253 to 127 Labor motion which would have pooled under one mandate all colonies not prepared for self-govern-

The resolution would also have put the House on record as favorno distribution of colonies without consent of natives. This would have been for the "common good of the world" it was contended. India, Ceylon, West Indies and other colonies almost ready selfgovernment would have been excluded from the pooling

The vote came after a discussion occupying much of the day on the colonial situation in the course of which Rt. Hon. Malcolm Mac-Donald, Secretary of State for the Dominions and Colonies, told the House that every part of the House and the government shared the view in agreement with British public opinion against return to Germany of colonies it lost during the Great War. However, Mr. Mac-Donald said, the question of return of German colonies did not appear to be an issue at this time. He agreed that the wishes of inhabitants of the colonies which might be involved should always be considered.

#### Dr. Telford Calls Prince Rupert "Siwash Village" And Won't Take It Back

VICTORIA, December 8: (CP)-Dr. Lyle Telford called Prince Rupert a "siwash village" in the Legislature this morning during discussion of the Redistribution Bill.

"So far as Prince Rupert is concerned, you know that's a siwash village," said Telford. There's an elevator there and other government undertakings where jobs can be handed around.

E. T. Kenney, member for Skeena, resented Telford's remarks, calling them disgraceful, but the C.C.F. member did not retract.

Telford remarked that two seats might be opened by the bill.

The debate on the bill's second reading was adjourned after R. L. Maitland, Opposition Leader, complained that the Conservatives had not been consulted in framing the new measure. He declared that the old electoral map had been satisfactory from 1933 to 1937.
