## HUNS ARE ON THE RUN

### GERMAN PEOPLE BECOME OUTSPOKEN AGAINST PRESENT REGIME

#### GERMANS DRIVEN FROM COAST AS KING AND QUEEN OF BELGIUM AGAIN ENTER PORT OF OSTEND

Belgian Offensive Produces Rich Results for Bruges, Thielt, Thourout and Ghistelles are all Taken; Huns May Try to Defend Line of Scheldt.

(Special to The News via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)  
London, October 18.—After having been occupied by the Germans for nearly four years, Ostend witnessed the re-entry of King and Queen of Belgium yesterday. In addition to marking the commencement of the German evacuation of Belgium, the event symbolizes also the reluctant abandonment by the war lords of their vain dream of obtaining a firm foothold on the sea coast which commands the channel through which passes the largest part of the world's sea-borne commerce. The prospect of Germany possessing a naval base on or sufficiently near to the English Channel or the Straits of Dover has vanished forever. The renewed Belgian offensive has produced rich results. In addition to the re-occupation of Ostend, the Allies have advanced beyond Ghistelles to the southeast, have pushed their way forward beyond Thielt and Thourout and have entered Bruges. The light resistance encountered indicates that the Germans have liberally abandoned the coastal regions of Belgium. They will probably defend the line of the Scheldt in greater force, but the capture of Lille, south of the Allies' salient, makes it unlikely that the Scheldt line can be permanently retained and further retirement will be necessitated by the deepening of the northern portion of the British salient toward Valenciennes.  
With the Allied Armies in Belgium, October 18.—Belgian troops entered Bruges late yesterday and the cavalry are operating on both sides. Belgian guns are now firing from south of the city. It is also reported that British outposts are east of Lille.  
Paris, October 18.—Belgian cavalry has penetrated Thielt. The capture of Courtrai and the practical evacuation of Zeebrugge also reported.  
Paris, October 18.—Ostend is occupied by the British. King Albert of Belgium and Queen Elizabeth entered Ostend yesterday afternoon.

#### PEACE DEMONSTRATIONS IN GERMANY ARE CONTINUED CROWD ATTEMPTS TO BURN STATUE OF HINDENBURG THE "DIVINE RIGHT OF KINGS" LAST HOUR HAS COME

(Special to The News via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)  
Paris, October 18.—Peace demonstrations continue in Germany. Groups of soldiers go through the streets of Berlin singing pacifist and revolutionary songs. Pan-Germans who attempted to hold a meeting before the Hindenburg statue were obliged to disperse and hooting crowds attempted to set fire to the statue. According to reports by General Ludendorff, some divisions have refused to obey orders, and soldiers hold meetings to discuss political questions.  
Berne, Switzerland, October 18.—Commenting on President Wilson's latest note to Germany, the Zurich Gazette says: "The last hour of the Divine right of Kings has come. It is not too soon. The old faction has long been considered an anachronism in our democratic era."  
Amsterdam, October 18.—The Handelsblad published with reserve the report that the German Admiralty has issued wireless instructions to all submarines to return to their bases.  
Buenos Ayres, October 18.—The Foreign Office has received a despatch from the Argentine Legation in Berlin saying the present situation in Germany is unbearable.

#### C. P. R. CONCESSIONS IN FREIGHT STRIKE

Offers to Reinstate All Men Outside Calgary and 75 per Cent. in City.  
(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)  
Ottawa, October 18.—In view of the growing seriousness of the freight handlers strike in Western Canada, Senator Robertson today had conferences with representatives of the Canadian Pacific railway, as a result of which the company has consented to an adjustment of the difficulties on a basis more favorable to the men than hitherto had been proposed. The company agrees to reinstate all men on strike outside the city of Calgary and at least 75 per cent. of those on strike at Calgary, the remaining 25 per cent. to be dealt with by the company. The company agrees when men return to work to submit all the matters in dispute to the Railway Adjustment Board.

#### AUSTRIA BROKEN INTO FOUR FEDERAL STATES

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)  
Berne, October 18.—Baron von Hussarek, the Austrian Premier, has made the announcement that Austria is about to be transformed into four federal states, according to advices received here.

#### EDMONTON MERCHANT SHOT BY A GUNMAN

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)  
Edmonton, October 18.—Joe Cameron, a Calgary gunman shot and killed Sam Morgan, a clothing store keeper, and Frank Beevers, city policeman. The latter was shot when attempting arrest. Cameron has not yet been captured.

#### REV. W. W. WRIGHT TO REMAIN IN RUPERT

At a congregational meeting of the Baptist Church held last evening, and presided over by Walter Daniels, the superintendent of Home Missions, who has been in the city for the last week or two, the resignation of the Rev. W. W. Wright was considered. Mr. Wright's resignation was tendered to his congregation in consideration of a call to the South Hill Baptist Church in Vancouver. The unanimous opinion of the congregation was that they did not want to lose Mr. Wright, and a deputation was despatched to interview him and persuade him to remain in Prince Rupert. This he finally agreed to do.

#### FIRST PROSECUTION

Calgary, October 18.—The first prosecutions under the anti-strike order are being taken here. Five C. P. R. shopmen have been summoned to appear in court charged with contravening the order.

#### FISH ARRIVALS

Boats arriving today were the Fisher, 12,000 lbs.; Reliance, 8,000; Joe Baker, 3,000, and Ingred, 7,000 lbs.

#### BRITISH ARMY STRUCK HARD AND AMERICANS MADE SOME ADVANCES; DOUAI IS TAKEN

(Special to The News via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)  
British Headquarters in France, October 18.—Yesterday was a black day for the German arms. While from Lille to the sea a wonderful crop of brilliant successes was being garnered the British fourth army struck hard on the Lecateau-Bohain front, southeast of Cambrai, where the enemy was trying to effect his main retreat. Heavy fighting resulted but the progress of Marshal Haig was satisfactory. The British are reported to be east of Molain and also east of St. Benin. The heaviest resistance was encountered at Lecateau. Prisoners from six different divisions taken number 4,800.  
With the American army North-west of Verdun, October 18.—In complete control of Cote Chatillon the Americans now hold the key to great stretches to the north and northeast. The hill is, in fact, the final of three keys, all of which have been bitterly defended. The first was Mamelle trench outside of Romagne, which when won, gave access to the equally vital Dame Marie, and that position in turn gave access to Chatillon.  
London, October 18.—British troops entered the town of Douai late yesterday after overgiving the enemy's resistance on the line of Haute Deule Canal. The fifth British army entered and captured Lille.

#### LATE FLASHES FROM SCENE OF BIG CONFLICT

Great Distress Reported in Evacuated Towns in Belgium—The Germans Are Still Retiring.  
(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)  
Paris, October 18.—North of Nish the Allied troops have reached Kanala and occupied the heights south of Jekrinas and Krushevatz. Greek troops have reached Kursumije and Novibazar. Ipsk Deen has been reached by French troops.  
London, October 18.—A statement has been issued that there is great distress among the population of the towns evacuated by the Germans. Homes have been destroyed and their male population between 16 and 60 seized for military work. The food of the Belgian Relief Commission to the amount of 20,000 pounds was seized in Roulers and what could not be carried off was destroyed.  
London, Oct. 18.—Tourecoing has been evacuated.  
Paris, October 18.—An advance of about two miles on a two-mile front northeast of Laferre is reported by the French War Office today. Violent fighting continues west of Grandpre where the French have crossed the Aisne.  
The Germans, fighting hard, are retiring towards Audenarde, 30 miles west of Brussels, hastily abandoning positions northeast of Laferre.  
London, October 18.—French troops have captured more than half of Andsgny Forest and have reached a point within two miles of Guise.  
4,000 Prisoners.  
London, Oct. 18.—Bruges has been evacuated.  
Over four thousand prisoners were captured by Field Marshal Haig's forces yesterday in Bohain in the Lecateau region.

#### BOY'S NARROW ESCAPE IN AUTO ACCIDENT

Sol Mussalem's Delivery Car Went Over Side at Hays Cove Circle This Morning.  
A nasty accident occurred this morning when Sol Mussalem's delivery auto went over the hillside at the corner of Fifth Ave. and Hays Cove Circle. George Stevens was driving the car, and there were several others in the rig at the time of the accident. Willie Lambie has a scalp wound, Jas. Gilchrist, a youngster eight or nine years old, was badly bruised, and the driver was cut about the head and face.  
Mrs. Hill and her daughter, who live on the Circle, heard the cries of the lads and rushed to the scene. They found another lady already there and while the other lady went to telephone for help Mrs. Hill and her daughter extricated one of the lads from beneath the wheels.  
A call sent in to Dr. Cade brought him and Constable Bailey to the scene and the lads were taken away for treatment.  
The car fell about 25 feet and the boys had a miraculous escape. The ladies who were first on the scene did excellent work in helping to extricate the boys.

#### FLUENZA MALADY SLIGHTLY IMPROVED

Toronto, October 18.—There is a change in the Spanish influenza situation in Ontario. While in some places, Ottawa and London in particular, report slightly improved conditions, news from other centers indicates an increase in the number of cases. Schools, churches, meetings, etc., are all shut down, this helping greatly.

#### THREE MEN DIE FROM PNEUMONIA ATTACKS

Peter Buchan, Jr., Son of Well Known Fisherman is Among Victims.  
This morning three deaths are reported from the General Hospital. In each case pneumonia was given as the cause. There are many other cases of pneumonia following attacks of influenza.  
Angelo Zanarda, an Italian and a miner from the Atlin country, was admitted to the hospital Oct. 13. He was 43 years old and he died yesterday. Another case was that of Abram Sartori, of 551 9th Ave., West, who was admitted last evening and died this morning. The third is Peter Buchan, Jr., who went into the hospital on the 15th and died at noon today. His mother resides at 121 Lorne St., Vancouver. He was the son of Peter Buchan, the fisherman, who is well known in town, and who belongs to the north of Scotland.

#### WILL HELP INDIANS

**Prepare for War While Hoping for Peace.**

It is not wise to be too optimistic over the peace talk. Lloyd's is charging a rate of only forty per cent. on insurance against the risk of a business being ruined by the coming of peace before the end of the year. That seems to indicate that they think the odds are against peace by that time. They offer a rate of sixty per cent. against peace by March next.

All are hoping for peace but there is an opinion prevalent that the Germans started their peace drive in the hope that the Allies would let them get back into their own country while the conference was going on, but that they had no idea of agreeing to the terms which they knew would be imposed. The only way to work for peace is to fight like demons and to pay like men. Victory bonds will be on the market soon and it is hoped it will be the last chance there will be to buy them.

**Fishermen Want Float at Once.**

There is a letter on another page from a fisherman who asks that The News keep up the agitation for a float until it meets with success. That was exactly what we intended to do. The writer expresses himself rather crudely perhaps, but he seems to know what he wants. It is not literature he is thinking about, but a float. The matter is one for serious consideration and is not to be dismissed lightly. If the float is really needed, and that seems to be the unanimous opinion of the fishermen, then it should be built at once and no obstacles should be put in the way of the carrying on of the work. Suitable dockage for the fishermen's boats is an essential in a fishing town.

**Cleaning the Huns Out of Holy Land.**

Many of those who look at the Holy Land through the spectacles of holy writ and the beautiful pictures of spotless robes as shown in the Sunday schools, will be glad to know that the Hun is being driven from the sacred places and that the ruthless Turk will defile them no more. Allenby is doing great work. He is taking no chances but steadily he is moving northward with his army.

It must not be imagined however that he is leaving behind him a beautiful land. A correspondent writing from Jerusalem says that it is a filthy place, and the same is true of many of the other cities which as children appealed to us. Filth, beggary, poverty, defile the Holy Cities and it will take a long time to bring them back to a condition which will appeal to the religious visitor.

**Women Should Prepare to Vote.**

Women must not forget that they now have the right to vote and that before long they will be called upon to exercise the franchise. The Dominion Government was elected for the period of the war, and soon after peace is declared it must be expected that there will be another election. Now is the time to prepare for this. Women as well as men should keep themselves informed on all matters of public interest in order that when the time comes they will be enabled to vote intelligently and not as their husbands tell them.

This is written with no idea of stirring up political turmoil. It is not wise, especially at a time like this, to set one party against another. The idea is to follow the course of events with care and from those, rather than from newspaper editorials, to form opinions on public questions which are free from bias and dogmatism.

It is often said that women are unable to reason, that they trust to intuition rather than to reason, and there is a measure of truth in the saying. Women often say they know because they know, rather than from any reason which they are able to give. They judge a person from an impression which they are unable to analyze. It is a common thing for a woman to say "that man is not honest," or "that woman is not truthful." Why, she does not know. She feels it. The impression is conveyed by intuition rather than from reasoning.

Women are much more impressionable than men and are more easily swayed by emotion. That is one reason why some people doubted if it would be wise to give them the franchise. As was often said during the women's rights campaign "she cannot do much worse than men have done and she will probably do better."

### MR. HINTON BOOSTS FOR NORTH COUNTRY

While in the city on his way back to the East, W. P. Hinton, vice-president and general manager of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway, remarked that he had been greatly impressed by the increased industrial activity in Victoria and at other points touched at since his arrival on the coast, says a recent issue of the Victoria Times.

He learned with satisfaction of the renewal of the wooden shipbuilding industry here, which he predicts will be the making of Victoria industrially and commercially. Great strides had been made in shipbuilding on the coast since his previous tour, and he would return east with a new insight into the industrial possibilities on the Pacific slope.

On this tour Mr. Hinton accompanied the Federal Ministers part of the way from the east, and came south with the party from Prince Rupert. Following the arrival of the steamship Prince Rupert on Wednesday he went on to Seattle by the same steamer, accompanied by Senator Richard Smeaton White.

Bound westward the party had a pleasurable tour. Mr. Hinton is a great booster for the northern country tapped by the Grand Trunk Pacific transcontinental. Large parties of settlers are locating in the more fertile sections of the province, particularly in the Bulkley and Nechaco valleys. Travel on the G. T. P. coast steamships is particularly good for the time of year. Now that the prairie farmers have harvested their crops they are beginning to find their way westward, holiday bent. Mr. Hinton predicts a rush of this class of travel to the coast this winter.

### FINANCING THE WAR FROM OWN POCKETS

During the first year of the war Canada was content to secure needed money elsewhere, but as the conflict lengthened and other nations felt the financial pinch the dictates of necessity, as well as self respect, demanded the flotation of loans at home. The business of raising war loans since then has been of increasing importance. The first domestic war loan, issued in November, 1915, was immediately successful, resulting in bank subscriptions of \$25,000,000 and public subscriptions of \$78,729,500 or a total of \$103,729,500. This in face of an objective of but \$50,000,000 was most gratifying.

#### Second and Third Loans.

By the following summer another domestic loan was needed, and a call for \$100,000,000 brought in \$201,444,800 of which \$50,000,000 was from the banks and \$151,444,800 from the public. In March, 1917, the third Canadian war loan was floated. The call was for \$150,000,000 and \$260,768,000 was realized, of which \$60,000,000 was from the banks and the balance from the public. It will thus be seen that the part played by the public greatly increased in each new issue.

The greatest success was in November, 1917, when the fourth loan was triumphantly floated. The request again was for \$150,000,000 and all from the public, but the subscriptions amounted to \$419,289,000. The interest of the public was demonstrated in remarkable degree, for while there were 24,862 subscribers to the first loan, 34,526 to the second and 40,800 to the third. In the

fourth no fewer than 820,035 subscribers were registered, or one in every 9.62 of the population of the Dominion.

George H. and Mrs. Hanson left last night on the Prince George en route to Washington, where he will stay a short time before proceeding to his new consulate in Denmark.

#### SERIES OF KICKS

Dear News:  
I want to see, just as soon as it can possibly be done, all the wheat for export from Alberta go through a government elevator and pass through the Panama Canal to Liverpool and foreign ports and the Far East. No, Mr. Editor, the above is not an extract from a speech of the Dominion ministers delivered in Prince Rupert, but from a speech of the Hon. J. D. Reid in Vancouver.

Did you notice the difference in the way the Ministers were handled in Vancouver and the way we entertained them here? Here that Old Women's Club, called the Board of Trade, invited them to a secret session. What took place the press did not report.

The Canadian Club gave them a dinner and allowed them to spread themselves, then they addressed a public meeting where they told us what a great country we had, but never a word about the fishing industry or the dry-dock. They told us we must produce wealth to pay the National Debt, but still leave our greatest wealth producer idle.

After they leave us we are informed that steel cannot be obtained, so we are just where we were four years ago. Carvell told us at the luncheon that we were an intelligent looking lot of people, and we ought to be able to get up and do something.

Vancouver has secured the contract to build eight steel ships of 10,000 tons each. Yet no steel here. WHY?

In Vancouver the Ministers were told by delegation after delegation that they had to have certain things and they were going to have them. They were not afraid to tell them that Vancouver suspected sinister influences were at work, and they got what they wanted.

The people in Prince Rupert are treated like children who must not be told too much. Even the City Council hints at certain performances performed by the new Sanitary Inspector that the public should not know of.

The Hospital Board in recent session asked the press not to publish the proceedings. Yet our papers publish the number of flu cases and deaths in other cities. What we need here is an organization of the people who will go right after our visitors and demand our just rights and who will keep going till we get them.

### SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only. Records will be granted covering only land which is non-timber land. Pre-emption pre-emptions abolished. Parties of not more than four may apply for adjacent pre-emptions, with improvements, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims. Pre-emptors must occupy claim for one year and make improvements to the value of \$100 per acre, including clearing of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant.

Pre-emptor in occupation not for 2 years, and has made improvements, he may, because of health or other cause, be granted immediate certificate of improvement to transfer his claim.

Records without permanent residence improvements to extent of \$500 per acre and records same as above. Failure to make improvements or record will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained on these claims in less than 5 years, with improvements of \$100 per acre, including 5 acres cleared, cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years.

Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may surrender another pre-emption, if he surrenders land in conjunction with pre-emption, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads. Lease to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions. Areas exceeding 20 acres may be leased by one person or company.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT. The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for a grant under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, to one year from the date of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

PROVISIONAL PROPERTY ALLOTMENT ACT. Provision is made for the grant to persons holding uncompleted Agreements to Purchase from the Crown of a proportion of the land, if divisible, and the payments already made will be in proportion to the sale price of the whole parcel. Two or more persons holding such Agreements may group their interests and apply for a proportionate allotment jointly. If it is not considered advisable to divide the land covered by an application for a proportionate allotment, an allotment of land of equal value selected from available Crown lands in the locality may be made. These allotments are conditional payment of all taxes due the Crown or to any municipality. The rights of persons to whom the purchase of the land has been agreed to are also protected. The decision of the Minister of Lands in respect to the allotment of a proportionate allotment is final. The time for making application for these allotments is limited to the 31st day of May, 1919. Any application made after this date will not be considered. These allotments apply to Crown lots and lands of the Crown sold at public auction.

### Good King Apples on Sale and Pumpkins for Hallow E'en Celebration.

In preparation for Hallow E'en there are plenty of pumpkins in town and they are selling at 8c. a pound. A new shipment of king apples arrived recently and these are going at from ten to twelve and a half cents a pound. Butter and eggs remain at about the same price.

The Cowichan eggs are the highest priced on the market, retailing at 90c. a dozen. They are sent out by the Cowichan Creamery Association and each egg is stamped with the date on which it was laid and the name of the poultryman. They are all guaranteed fresh. The Association is a co-operative one and has been in existence for many years. Through it the farmers buy and sell a good deal of their produce, and they do not retail.

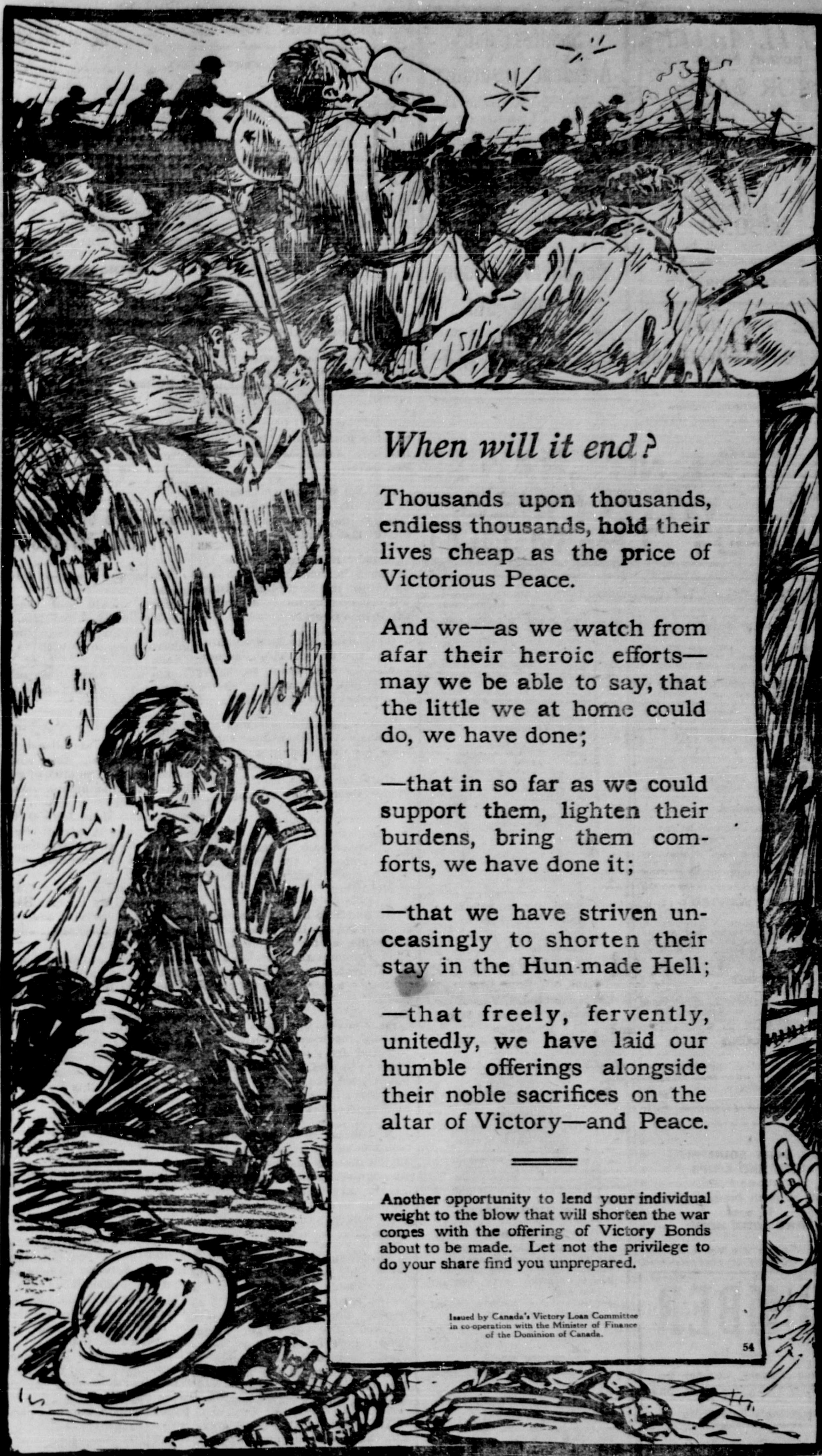

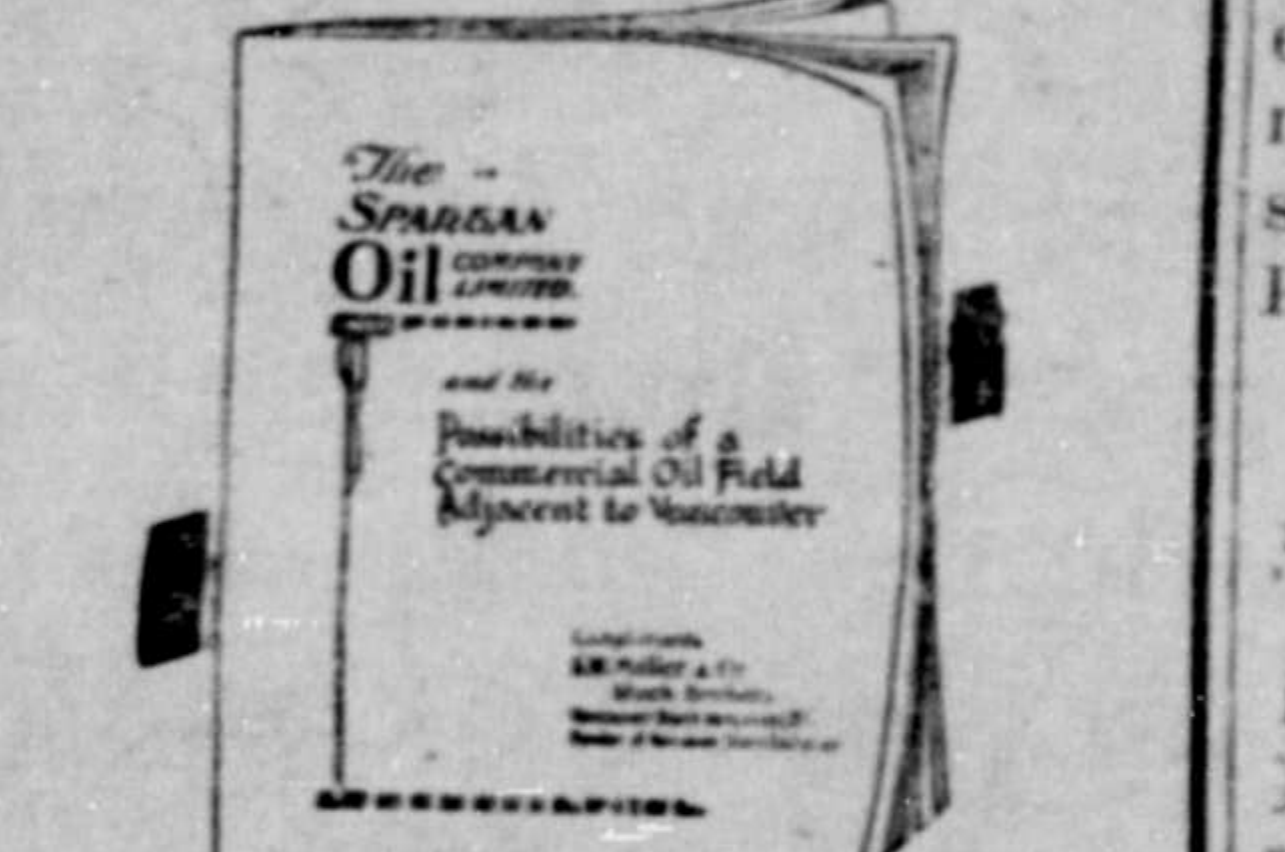
