Paris, Nov. 7: (CP)—French economists said yesterday that Germany was attempting to close European supply sources to Great Britain and France in the hope of offsetting the Allied blockade of Germany and the repeal of the United States arms embargo.

Fearful Of War, Belgium And Holland Try To Stay Out; Two Monarchs Meet

LONDON, November 7.—An Exchange telegraph says that Germany has sent what amounts to an economic ultimatum to Belgium and Holland demanding commercial concessions under threat of military and economic pressure.

King Leopold of Belgium arrived unexpectedly in The Hague Monday to visit with Queen Wilhelmina of Holland. The Belgian king was accompanied by his foreign minister.

There was further extension of martial law in Belgium today.

SOVIET IS CRITICAL

Lashes Out At United States, Italy, And Japan—Urges Workers' Revolt

MOSCOW, November 7: (CP)—Communist Internationale Monday called workers of Great Britain and France to "go against those who favor continuation of imperialistic war"

The Internationale also assailed the United States for repealing the arms embargo and also attacked Italy and Japan, urging support of Nationalist China.

ASKS FOR BIG LOAN

British Chancellor To Raise Over Billion Dollars To Prosecute War

LONDON, November 7: (CP)—Sir John Simon, Chancellor of the Exchequer, asked Parliament today for authority to borrow an additional sum not exceeding £250,000,000, about \$1,125,000,000 for supply, principally for war purposes.

DRIVE OFF AIRPLANES

Light British Warships And Polish Destroyers Prove Effective In Combat

LONDON, November 7: (CP)—The Admiralty announced today that light British ships, aided by Polish destroyers, had fought off an attack by German airplanes in the North Sea without suffering damage.

Earlier bombers had been reported sighted over the Shetland Islands, north of Scotland, being driven off into the haze by hot British anti-aircraft fire.

CANNOT BE DISLODGED

German Attacks Fail To Penetrate Allied Lines—Artillery And Infantry Activity

Paris, November 7: (CP)—Intermittent German artillery fire has failed to dislodge the French from Forbach and other positions on the Western Front.

Patrol skirmishes and artillery action have been general on both sides along the 100 mile northern flank but French attention has been rivetted to the south, due apparently to the first German attempt to cross the Rhine, natural barrier in that area.

'Shoddy Rhetorics, Cheap Heroics' Says Colin Cameron In Criticism Of Imperial Government Policies

Another Warning By Premier Pattullo—Conservative Member is Indignant—Speaker Leaves it to House to Decide Upon Discipline

VICTORIA, November 7: (CP)—Colin Cameron, C.C.F. member for Comox, in the Legislature, attacked the actions of the British government as "shoddy rhetorics, cheap heroics."

War News

ISSUE PEACE OFFER AMSTERDAM—Queen Wilhelmina of the Netherlands and King Leopold of Belgium today sent messages to Germany, Great Britain and France jointly offering their good offices for peace.

FIGHTS FOR "NEW WORLD" LONDON—Foreign Secretary Viscount Halifax said today that Great Britain was fighting for a "new world" in which nations would be immune from "insane armed rivalry."

U-BOAT LOSSES DOWN LONDON—Convinced that the U-boat menace is now fairly mastered, Great Britain has mapped plans to draw on vast Empire resources for supplies.

PUNJAB TO HELP CALCUTTA—The Punjab Assembly by a vote of 104 to 39 approved a resolution to aid England in the war, being agreeable to the constitution being reviewed at the end of the war with a view to self-government.

DEUTSCHLAND OFF AZORES LONDON—The German pocket battleship Deutschland is reported to have been sighted off the Azores. Ten days ago she had been reported off Newfoundland.

R.A.F. RECONNAISSANCE LONDON—Royal Air Force planes made their twentieth reconnaissance flight over western Germany yesterday.

EVADING NEUTRALITY WASHINGTON—The United States Maritime Commission has deferred permission to convert eight large ships from United States to Panama registry in order to engage in cargo carrying to the war zones under the new neutrality laws.

ed the entrance to the Baltic Sea, necessitating overland shipments to ports outside. The British are believed to be contemplating blockading neutral ports through which shipments may be made to Germany.
