STRENGTH OF RUSSIA

Russia is undoubtedly a formidable factor in the world today. so formidable that all countries are looking and wondering. While no person outside the Kremlin probably knows just how many soldiers she has, how many Miss Miller defeated Mrs. Barry, strength of her navy, all are forces to be reckoned with.

> The Russian army is variously estimated at from a million and a quarter to two million men. That is a huge army but nothing like all of it could be made available at any one point. The military strength of a country depends more upon how many men can be put in the field at a danger point and how they can be properly fed and moved and suplied with ammunition. Russia is strong at home but she has had little experience in fighting outside her own territory, except perhaps in Mongolia. One factor to consider is, how many men she could put into a war against Germany and also how many would she?. She is a rather uncertain factor.

> In the matter of an air force Russia is strong in numbers and she may have enough skilled pilots and technicians. It has been said that she has the strongest air force in the world but that would mean that she has the best trained men. She is said to have 200,000 pilots of whom 75 per cent are fully trained for war.

As for the navy, experts do not seem to think very much of the Soviet sea force. Much depends upon whether they are kept up to date and are sufficiently supported by modern speedy small craft.

Should there be war, it is probable that there will be many surprises for the world and they may not all be in favor of the Rome-Berlin axis. It is possible that Russia may be stronger or weaker than we think. It is probable that London has a pretty good idea of what Britain might have to meet should she be forced to fight.
