JUNEAU, Feb. 15 .- Pilot Sheldon Simmons reported sighting late yesterday along a beach south of Juneau what he thought might be wreckage of the seaplane of Pilot Len Cope which disappeared Sunday on a flight from Ketchikan to Juneau with four passengers on board.

Coastguard vessels immediately rushed to the scene to definitely establish the identity of the debris and search for survivors.

Faint radio signals picked up vesterday indicated that there might still be a chance of those aboard the plane being cast up and still alive.

Weather cleared sufficiently late yesterday to permit of the use of aircraft in the search. They had been held down by snow and poor visibility.




