> LONDON, March 18: (CP)-The British government acting in concert with France, today directed its ambassador in Berlin to deliver a formal note to the German government saying that the invasion of Czechoslovakia represented "complete repudiation of the Munich agreement." The Foreign Office also announced that the note which Sir Neville Henderson was being instructed to present would state that "His Majesty's government regards as without legal basis changes effected by Germany's military action in Czechoslovakia."

The British announcement said that "recent events in Central Europe represent a complete repudiation of the Munich agreement and undertakings for peaceful co-operation exchanged at that time."

Meanwhile Foreign Secretary Viscount Halifax consulted French, United States and Russian ambassadors.

Indicating the urgency with which Great Britain considered the situation, Prime Minister Chamberlain summoned the cabinet into an unusual Saturday night meeting which began at five o'clock. The cabinet session lasted two-and-a-half hours. No immediate statement was made but it was understood there was study of organization of European balance of power against German aggression.

Political circles speculated on the possibility of a snap general election, chiefly on the conscription issue.

A spokesman of the Roumanian legation said today that his government had received and rejected sweeping demands by Germany for complete economic co-operation as the price of guarantees of Roumanian territory security.

The proposals were said to be that Germany would guarantee territorial integrity and independence to the Roumanian people if Roumania would export exclusively to Germany grain, oil, lumber, cattle and foodstuffs. Roumania would be expected to cease building up her industries and turn instead to agriculture.

Germany is still stretching out towards Hungary and Poland and, after that, it will be either the Russian Ukraine or France. No one can be quite sure which move will be next but, evidently, the Germans are intent on conquest. They cannot be allowed to go on or they will eventually cross the Atlantic and try to take this continent. It is something that must be stopped, no matter at what ex-

pense.

#### WHO HAS THE BRAINS?

To judge from some of the conversations one hears around the city it would seem as if the Nazi Germans had all the brains of the world in their organization and that nobody outside that select circle knew anything. German governmental group has been talking so much about its strength and has been bluffing its way through so often that people have begun to wonder if there is any power strong enough and with brains enough to stand up to them. The Germans have been banking on the British and French desire for peace until conquest and expansion has become an obsession with them.

Much has been heard of the danger to London in case of war. Our guess is that the moment any attempt is made to bomb London, a fleet of British bombing planes will appear over Berlin and give them the first taste the people there have ever felt of what war means. The war will be fought in Germany as well as in other countries if it is ever fought. That will be a new experience.





The board of directors presented a report of the season's operations covering the stores and fish. The total sales for the year 1938 were \$76,469.04, the gross profit was \$10,-205.18 and the net profit \$3,175.64. There was an inventory of goods on hand at cost of \$13,312.35 at the close of the year. There was a total of \$57,318.04 current assets and \$13,822.42 fixed assets, making a grand total of \$71,140.46. The liabilities to the fishermen at the end of the year were \$40,881.31, making a total of \$7610.62. The legal reserve set aside is \$1188.50 and reserve for doubtful accounts \$323.30. leaving a net undivided surplus of \$7,101.86. The profits on the stores were \$3.175.64, fish packers, \$1799.66, fish sales \$3,175.64. The total production of fish for the year 1938 was 2,256,158 pounds. Prior to the end of 1938 the fishermen had been paid out for fish delivered the sum of \$148,103.24 and, since the beginning of 1939, there has been an additional amount of \$38 .-250.06 paid out to the fishermen. Most of the latter amount has been paid since the beginning of March so that the fishermen had a "nest egg" this spring that they usually did not receive. This has had tendency to boost business in the


