Once the "Queen of the Seas" and peer in speed and size of all passenger vessels plying the Atlantic swells, the S.S. Leviathan is now just a rotting hulk at Pier Four, Hoboken, N.J. Christened the Vaterland when launched in 1904, and pride of the German merchantile fleet, the ship had made only two and one-half crossings for Germany when America entered the world war and she was seized by U.S. government and pressed into transport service. After the war, the ship continued as passenger queen until the early 1930's when vessels I ke the Europa. Bremen and others outoid her in speed and style. Since 1934 the Leviathan has been tied up in Hoboken, idle and lifeless, where she is rapidly becoming a landmark and where she will stay until the U.S. army or navy decided to take her as a training ship or some foreign power receives permission to purchase the hulk. The ship is kept in a state of repair with a crew of 22 men under Captain Charles S. Lenz (right) instead of the 900 needed when she was a first class liner.
