property and taking away any that has accrued during war days. This would prevent the seandal of the war barons who developed their estates during the Great War while their fellow citizens were fighting overseas.

Some such plan should be followed in Canada. At anyrate the possibility of anyone profiting from supplying goods or munitions or receiving high salaries as a result of any war in which we might possibly be implicated should be removed. Whether the Churchill method is the best for preventing war profits we do not know but many people think that, if there should come a time when conscription is necessary, there should be conscription of wealth as well as man power.

PERIOD OF GRAB

Evidently this is a period of grab in Europe. The defeat of the Spanish government gives great opportunity for land hungry powers to try to add to their territory. Great Britain is aware of this and is trying to head it off. We hope there is success in the efforts.

DANGER TO CHILDREN

This is a period of great danger to the children of Prince Rupert. Many of them enjoy sledding on the streets and sidewalks and possibly there are places where there is no danger. Other places are very dangerous-so dangerous that to allow it seems almost criminal.

In Ketchikan this week a boy was killed when his sleigh ran beneath an auto. Many near accidents have occurred in Prince Rupert and, in some cases, no doubt, no one but the children themselves or their parents would have been to blame if there had been a serious accident.

May we suggest to parents that they warn their children and ask that in a few of the worst places a little superivsion from the authorities might be helpful in preventing something which would stop all coasting on all the streets.
