B.N.A. ACT DISCUSSED

Indian Jurists Hear Ruling of Canadian Court... By G. E. POWELL... Canadian Press Correspondent CALCUTTA, India, Jan. 13: (CP)—Canadian cases figure prominently in a judgment delivered by India's federal court at New Delhi in the first important matter brought before it.

Discusses B.N.A. Act... During the hearing numerous cases in Canada referring to Dominion and provincial legislative spheres were cited.

The chief justice goes on to say: "The decisions of Canadian and Australian courts are not binding upon us, and still less those of the United States, but, where they are relevant, they will always be listened to in this court with respect and attention as the judgments of eminent men, accustomed to expound and illumine the principles of a jurisprudence similar to our own and, if this court is so fortunate as to find itself in agreement with them, it will deem its own opinion to be strengthened and confirmed."

His Lordship added: "I conceive that a broad and liberal spirit should inspire those whose duty it is to interpret a federal constitution with its nice balance of jurisdictions."

The federal court's views take the form of a report to the governor-general and theoretically appeal lies to the judicial committee of the Privy Council in London. Some newspapers point out that this case illustrates the need for introducing the federal part of the constitution as soon as possible as such disputes are less likely when elected elements are in power at the Centre as well as in the provinces.

It is expected the Indian princes will make up their minds in 1939 about joining the Federation.
