Revenue Minister J. L. Ilsley Becomes Minister of Finance-Col. Colin Gibson and Col. Mulock **Enter** Government

OTTAWA, July 8: (CP)-Appointment of Premier Angus L. Macdonald of Nova Scotia as defence minister for naval services and promotion to ministerial rank of two Liberal mambers of the House of Commons is announced today by Prime Minister William Lyon Mackenzie King.

Minister of Public Works J. P. A. Cardin and Munitions Minister C. D. Howe will divide the transport department portfolio which Howe held as well as munitions and supply for the past few months.

Revenue Minister J. L. Ilsley is made minister of finance succeeding Hon. J. C. Ralston who went to the Department of National Defence last Friday.

Ilsley is succeeded by Col. Colin Gibson M.P., Hamilton West, while Col. W. P. Mulock, M.P. for North York, becomes Postmaster General.
