PARIS, June 12: (CP)—The courage and confidence of the people of France is unquestionable and intensification of the war has brought a corresponding stiffening of their determination and morale, said Major-General L. R. LaFleche, military attache of the Canadian legation in Paris and former deputy minister of

national defence at Ottawa.

General LaFleche spoke with + warm admiration for the high quality, the strategical and technical genius of the French army and its command. He said: "General Weygand inspires every confidence * while Marshal Petain, whose name will be forever associated with the victory of Verdun in the First Grea; War, is one of the outstanding soldiers of our time and our enemies know it.

"The spirit is excellent. There's no fanfare or exaggeration. These men face facts, take reverses calmly and do not give way to premature enthusiasm. Yet there's not the slightest doubt that final victory shall be ours."
