### Win War First And Talk Of Aims After, Churchill Says; Are Fighting For Survival

LONDON, October 15: (CP)-Prime Minister Winston Churchill told the House of Commons today that the time had not yet come when any official declaration can be made on war aims beyond very careful general statements. "We are not fighting the war merely to maintain the status quo of Europe but, among other things, to survive," he said. "When our capacity to do that is more generally recognized throughout the world, we shall be in a position to take a further view of what we shall do when victory is v. on." Meanwhile, said the Premier, winning the victory was a matter of greater importance than discussing war aims.

Miller, Aliford Bay; Japan but the argument is not well taken that Canada Carr, San Francisco. We York; J. S. should devote her whole energies to war work. Unless Canada keeps up some of her export business she will find it difficult to purchase goods from other countries. Already this country is handicapped over ten per cent through the inequality of imports as compared with exports. Our exports pay for our imports. If we continue to import and do not export we shall eventually do neither.

It will be noted that, in spite of the fact that Britain is fighting for her existence, she is still shipping goods out of the country in order to pay for the war material she is importing.

### China Holding Out - - -

For well over three years the Chinese have been holding out against Japan. They still have a large well trained army of men in addition to hundreds of small groups who continue to haress the invaders. Japan seems to be no nearer winning the war than she was two years ago. The reopening of the Burma Road will help China. It is a terrible road but a huge amount of war material has been hauled over it into central China and, doubtless, more will go in that way this winter and possibly during the coming summer.



# OUTSPOKEN

United States Not To Be Cajoled Out Of Helping Great Britain

DAYTON, Oct. 15:-Speaking at Dayton, Saturday night. President Franklin D. Roosevelt reiterated that Great Britain, the last shield of democracy, would receive from the United States all aid short of declaration of war. No threats of aggression or dictators would prevent this being done. United States would continue to give help to the last free people holding aggressors at bay. The President rejected any policy of appeasement, insisted upon peaceful use of the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans for trade and pledged the United States Navy and Air Force to the defence of all countries of the Western Hemisphere. \*

"Our course is clear. Our decision is made," the President declared.

After referring to the love of American people for freedom, decency and honesty, Mr. Roosevelt stated that men and women of Great Britain were showing the world how a free people could fight for what they knew to be right. Their heroic defence was demonstrating how democracy, when put to the test, could show the stuff of which it was made. The president referred to cries

of "Viva la Democracia" (Long. Live Democracy) which he had heard so often during a trip to South America. That cry echoed in greeting to the people of the Americas.


