London Hears Fuehrer and Franco Conferring on Frontier

LONDON, Oct. 23: (CP)-A **Reuters dispatch from Madrid** quoted a German wireless report as saying that Chancellor Adelf Hitler of Germany and General Francisco Franco of Spain, accompanied by their foreign ministers, have arrived at the French-Spanish frontier where they are presumably conferring. Reports in Spain said that the leaders had had two meetings.

Lisbon earlier today reported General Francisco Franco enroute today to San Sehastian near the Franco-Spanish frontier where it was rumored he might meet the German foreign minister, Joachim von Ribbentrop.

An officiai statement said that Franco was on his way to San Sebastian to meet "one of the world's leading personalities."
