#### AS TO SALE OF GOVERNMENT LOTS.

The Manson way and the McBride way are as different from the Liberal way of dealing with government lands situate in municipalities as chalk is to cheeese. William Manson repeats! with pride the words of his master, McBride, that, so far as the town lots in this city belonging to the government are concerned the provincial government is in the real estate business good and hard. Sir Wilfrid Laurier, the great Liberal leader, said Regina just as "good and hard" that "the government IS NO in the real estate business."

This was in 1895, a time when the Dominion was not enjoying anything like the prosperity which came later, and her coffers were not bulging like those of this province are today. Sir Wilfrid was making a tour of the West, and it was pointed out to him that the residents of two growing towns in Sas-I katchewan, Regina and Moose Jaw, were under great hardships in carrying out city improvements for the reason that the government owned a great part of the two townsites and the Canadian Pacific Railway practically the remainder. The railway did sell a part of its lots or there could have been no towns, but it's dogin-the-manger policy led it to refuse to sell more. It was like the McBride government, in the real estate business good and

These company lots were exempt from city taxation for twenty years; also the government lots were exempt altogether from taxation. Therefore all city improvements had to be paid for, as they are today in Prince Rupert, by the few individual property holders. Under those conditions, it was pointed out to Sir Wilfrid, there could not possibly be any speedy growth of these promising cities.

Sir Wilfrid was quick to see the point and to appreciate the situation. It was then he declared that the government was certainly not in the real estate business, and that he would see to it on his return to Ottawa that the land in these cities belonging to the government should be TURNED OVER TO THE MUNICI-PALITIES. Not held until the struggles of individual adjacent property holders had made the lots very valuable, which is exactly what McBride is doing in Rupert and which course so excites William Manson's admiration.

The lands in quesiton were turned over to the cities mentioned, and the proceeds from their sales, and the taxes they begun to pay, enabled Moose Jaw and Regina to plan and carry out improvements on a scale that commanded attention and ensured rapid growth.

The government lots in this city are valued at thirteen millions now and their value rapidly rising. But if the city was receiving taxes on those thirteen millions we would not be so hard up, would we? And there would be no room or excuse! for those mysterious hints of impending disaster from Mayor Newton. So why support William Manson and the real estate policy that is impoverishing Prince Rupert?
