### **Basic Dividends**

Mr. Aberhart had claimed in his Institute broadcasts that under Social Credit it would be possible to pay "basic dividends" each month to every man, woman and child in the province. After his administration was sworn into office, he said that 18 months at least would be needed before the first dividend would be paid. He has said since that the failure of the government to pay them was due to federal interference with his legislation.

The Premier has held cabinet portfolios during his term. At present, in addition to being Premier he is minister of education and attornev-General. As head of the ministry of education, his administration gained fame through the taxes for all of them.
