

POLITICAL INDEPENDENCE OR RING TYRANNY.

The electorate of Prince Rupert in voting tomorrow should determine to make local issues the paramount consideration. The general issues of the campaign, those in regard to squandering the public funds in paralleling railways instead of aiding railways for the purpose of opening up new country; the selfish grabbing of the revenues from this part of the province to enrich the southern half; the trafficking with capitalists for huge blocks of the choicest public lands, leaving the undesirable portions for the pre-emptor and then taxing the poor fellow to the hill: these are results of the Two-Man government we decry, deplore and denounce, and your vote should be for the candidate who is best fifted by his ability and independence to make this strong denouncement in the legislature at Victoria.

All these points, however, have been well discussed in every precinct of the riding, and from each one of them we can depend upon a strong denunciation of such practices even should it be based on no higher a principle than personal interest.

But to us of Prince Rupert there is a question to be solved of more immediate importance-one upon which we need action at once. That is, are we to continue under the domination of Ring Rule? This domination interferes with the work of our city council; interferes with the administration of justice in police cases; is retarding to a material degree the natural progress of the city and keeping the people in endless broils. There is only one way to break this Ring and that is by electing the Liberal candidate, Alex. M. Manson. If you give him a good majority in this city the rest of the riding will answer for itself.

"Weigh up the good William Manson has accomplished" and in the shifting sands of William's character you will not find a color). "If we did not believe William Manson was much preferable to some of those who are so severely criticising him, we would not be boosting him.
