IT'S ALL OVER BUT THE SHOUTING.

The Liberals all over the riding have worked most manfully and are certain this evening to be rewarded by seeing a large vote rolled up for their candidate. The disadvantages under which they have worked are too many to be listed. The present system of taxation is onerous and unjust. The control of the police and license commissioners in the hands of the Attorney General is used for political ends.

The election has been forced on the country without any necessity of the same and without sufficient notice being given.

LIBERALISM IN VICTORIA

Independent Conservatives Deserting Their Party and Assisting to Return Two Liberal Members to Next Legislature

There is found by party workers a strong body of opinion among Conservatives that there should be effective opposition, and as they have no doubt as to the victory of the government generally they are all the more inclined to drop the two weaker members of the Conservative ticket and give those votes to Liberal candidates.

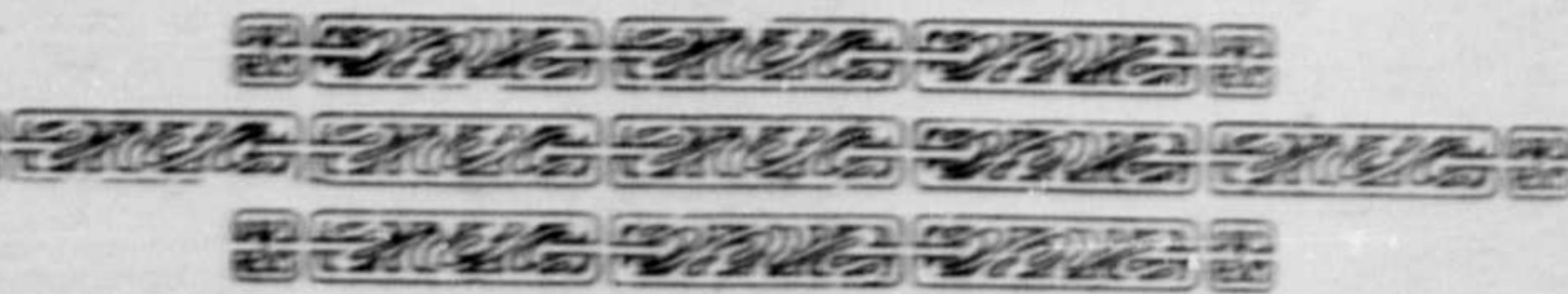

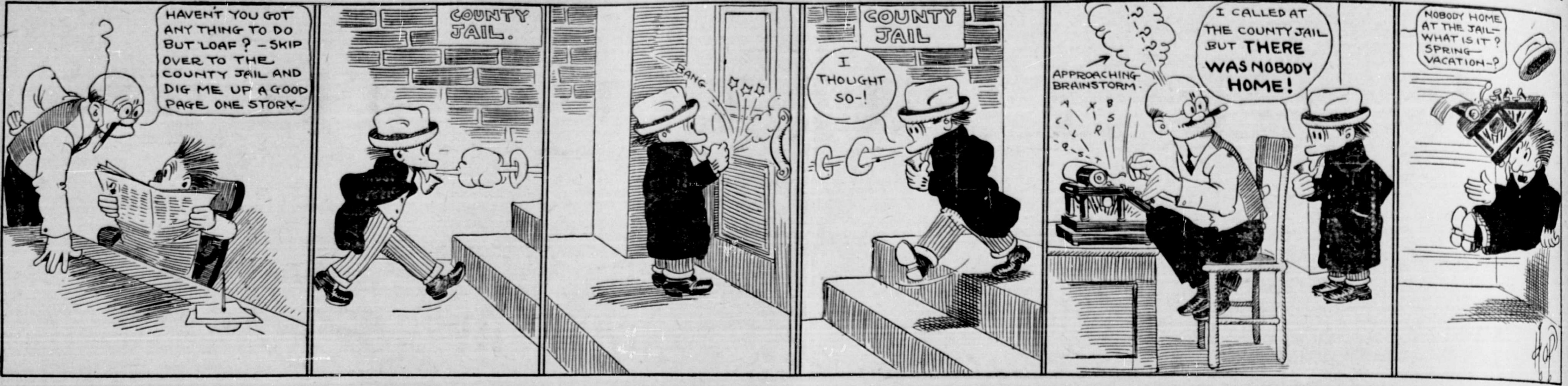
