Norway Takes German U-Boat OSLO, Norway, March 28: (CP)—A German submarine, which became stranded two miles off Odden, Norway, has been interned with its crew. The u-boat was obviously operating within Norwegian territorial waters.

FRONT HAS LIVENED UP French Have No Difficulty in Repulsing Enemy Attacks—Holland and Denmark Fear Invasion PARIS, March 28: (CP)—Successive raids, waves of artillery fire and patrol fighting brought unusual action yesterday to the central section of the Western Front. All German attacks on French posts were repulsed with ease. The high command reported a calm night.

Check Up On Spies LONDON, March 28: (CP)—The authorities have launched a drive to prevent contact between foreign seamen and enemy agents by placing sentries, beside all neutral freighters and fishing boats off Grimsby and Hull. Members of crews of foreign boats will not be permitted ashore in British ports and no visitors will be allowed to go aboard.

QUEBEC TO HAVE TORY Gaspé Swings From Liberal To Doubtful Column—Government Now Has Clear Majority Of 110 OTTAWA, March 28: (CP)—Gaspé constituency in Quebec entered the doubtful column today when Dominion election results from remote Magdalen Islands gave J. S. Roy, Independent Conservative, a lead of seventeen over the former Liberal member, Maurice Brasel, whose election had been conceded. It is possible, however, that the military vote may again change the result.

Allies Move To Line Up Balkans In More Favorable Position Envoys Being Called Home For Consultation—Looks Like Russia is Now Shying Away From Axis

LONDON, March 28: (CP)—An intensive Allied counter offensive in the Balkans is interpreted to be foreshadowed by the calling to London for consultation with Foreign Secretary Lord Halifax as to the situation in the various countries of the British ambassador to Turkey and the ministers to Bulgaria, Greece, Roumania, Hungary and Jugo-Slavia. Announcement of the calling home of the envoys was made today by the Foreign Office news department. They are expected to arrive early next month when Sir Percy Loraine, British ambassador to Italy, is also expected to be in London.

Oceanic Earth Shock Recorded Disturbance Believed To Have Been Centred In Pacific Ocean North Of Marquesas Islands

BERKELEY, Cal., March 28:—The University of California seismograph yesterday recorded an earthquake the centre of which was believed to be about 2800 miles northeast of the Marquesas Islands in the South Pacific Ocean.

WELLES IS BACK HOME United States Envoy Retient About Results of Trip—Renorting Direct To White House

NEW YORK, March 28.—Sumner Welles, United States Under Secretary of State, landed today from the Italian liner Comte di Savoia following his fact-finding trip to Europe and met and escorted by police, immediately entrained for Washington to report to President Franklin D. Roosevelt on his tour.

Bulletins WELLS OUTSPOKEN LONDON—Speaking today, H. G. Wells accused Prime Minister Chamberlain and Foreign Secretary Halifax of "playing around with war." Wells declared: "Everyone knows that the government is grossly incompetent but no one dare replace them."

FRENCH WARSHIP BLAST PARIS—The marine ministry announces that seven seamen were killed and several injured in an explosion aboard a French destroyer at an unnamed port. It was an accident, it is said. Casablanca, Morocco, is unofficially stated to have been the scene of the blast.

PASSING OF JAMES ROSS Resident of Thirty-Two Years Standing In Prince Rupert Dies In Hospital

A well known pioneer of Prince Rupert passed away this morning in the person of James Ross who came here thirty-two years ago as a storekeeper on railway construction work, later being at Anyox in a similar capacity for the Granby Co. He was 72 years of age and had been only since last Saturday in the Prince Rupert General Hospital where he passed away.

France has requested that Surits be recalled home to Moscow.

EDITORIALS

AN OUTSTANDING GESTURE

In considering the significance of the general election that is now a matter of history, we have to remember that it was the present administration that declared war upon Germany and that, if it had been beaten it might have been considered that its defeat meant that the action taken was considered to be wrong. The victory of the Liberal party now goes out to the world as an indication that the people of Canada are behind those who declared war and that they intend to continue it until victory is attained.

And it means more than that. An analysis of the vote indicates that every province of Canada is with the government in the stand it has taken, including French-speaking, Roman Catholic Quebec. In fact, the country is united in its desire to defeat international power politics, no matter where it may be found, whether in Germany, Russia or any other country.

One more significant feature of the election contest is the fact that but a very small minority of the people have shown themselves, through the election, as opposed to Canadian participation in the war and those are chiefly men and women of communistic inclinations. The percentage in Canada is not any greater than in Great Britain or France.

On the whole the election result is most satisfactory and in saying that we do not forget that Dr. Manion was just as keen to carry on the war as is Mackenzie King. Usually the extreme fire-eaters, the men who would demand immediate conscription, voted Conservative. The moderate element is Liberal. These people have no use for anything smacking of Communism and neither do they wish Canada to develop into a warlike nation.

THESE GRAFTERS

The worst feature of elections is the desire to win by imputing evil motives to those to whom we are opposed. Such words as "grafters" were used freely, if not on the platform, at least on the street. Yet we must remember that those journals most bitterly opposed to the former minister of defence were most careful to state that they did not impute anything illegal such as graft against Mr. Mackenzie. All they suggested was that his transactions were unbusinesslike.

It is any wonder that third parties should say that all politicians are crooks when members of either old party are all too eager to impute evil motives to everything their opponents do. It is an evil mind that is always ready to do that.

SACRED CONCERT

Last Monday evening a very delightful sacred concert was given at St. Paul's Lutheran Church. The well known mixed choir, the Varden Singers, under the able direction of Peter Lien, had been working on this program for several months. It consisted of sacred songs of historic origin and permanent value, picturing the entire story of the Passion of Christ, as recorded in the Four Gospels and also bringing out the spiritual and ethical value of this story to mankind.

After the classic "Prelude" by Mozart, played on the organ by Mr. Lien, the chorus and congregation sang jointly a hymn depicting the Biblical records of Christ's last dramatic entry into Jerusalem on what has been called Palm Sunday. The chorus then rendered in succession eight songs, based entirely on the "Via Dolorosa," as recorded in the New Testament. The text of the songs were in most cases original productions in Norwegian, Swedish and Finnish hymnologists of historic renown. In some cases the songs were reproductions of sacred hymns by such personalities as Bernhard of Clairvaux. The songs had been set to music by Scandinavian and Finnish masters of choral singing, also by the now world famous director of the just as world famous A Capella Chorus, the St. Olaf College Choir of Northfield, Minnesota, Dr. F. Mellius Christianson. These songs, rendered very effectively by the Varden Singers, presented with dramatic impact and a touching appeal the entire Good Friday event, especially the Crucifixion of Christ.

Finally, the entire sacred drama was climaxed in the several majestic hymns, that for many centuries have been the common heritage of all Christendom. Those hymns are all based on the Easter Message, the Resurrection of Christ. All the songs brought out pointedly both the sacred records of the most marvelous event in all human history and the spiritual significance of those events to all humanity. Fittingly, the last song was the Twenty-Third Psalm, set to music by one of the later, but highly gifted organists and composers of Norway, Lars Soraas of Bergen.

Mrs. Aalug Lindseth and Bernhard Petersen were soloists, soprano and tenor, respectively and Peter Lein was director and organist.

Between each song the pastor gave a very brief introduction to the songs as they were rendered. This was mainly in the form of basic Scripture passages.

The catch limit of Area No. 2 remains at 22,700,000 pounds and of Area No. 3 at 25,300,000 pounds. For closer supervision, each trip by various vessels will be licensed for one of the regulatory areas instead of being given general clearance as in the past. The catch is restricted to halibut of not less than five pounds dressed.
