The British Admiralty also announces that, in a five-day bombardment of Bardia, three supply ships were sunk when a light force penetrated the inner harbor.

During the past week a British submarine sank a heavily laden Italian supply ship and a large Italian tanker south of Italy.

The British continued their remorseless pounding of Bardia today with the Italians, trapped in the beleagured Italian port battling fiercely to break through the blocked line of retreat to the west.

Meanwhile the Royal Air Force blasted the Libyan coast westward to Derna, 175 miles from the Egyptian frontier. Practically the entire military camp at Derna was left

## ITALIANS PERISHING

Intense Cold Causes Hundreds of Deaths Among Albanian Troops -Fascist Retreat Continues

ATHENS, Dec. 20: (CP)- The Italians in Albania are having to fight cold weather as well as the Greeks and it is also a losing fight. According to advices reaching here, hundreds of Italian soldiers, poorly equipped for such conditions as they . are having to face, have been found frozen to death. Temperature has been running twenty-two below along parts of the mountain front and, in addition, there are deep snows. The Greeks themselves are changing sentries every half an hour on account of the rigors of the weather.

Meanwhile the Italian retreat continues to be general. Abandoning three key points, they are falling back towards Chimara and Valona on the coast and Port Palermo is in danger of falling, having been already reported abandoned. 


