Waterfront Whiffs
Announcement of Opening of Halibut Season—Nelson Bros. Cannery Here Is Active Again

Most interesting announcement of the past week to local fisheries circles was that of the International Fisheries Commission which made known that it had recommended to the two governments that April 1 be again appointed for the opening of the 1941 fishing season under international treaty.

In view of the commission having recommended this date after having heard the views of the various halibut fishing interests on the matter and some of them do not approve of April 1 at that, it is more than likely that it will later be officially decreed the opening date. Local halibut fishing interests would have preferred a later date in order to keep out the part time vessels which fish halibut in the spring before salmon fishing and other such pursuits get under way.
