# FRENCH FIGHT FRENCH

LONDON-The Vichy government of France may launch an attack against Free French forces in French Equatorial Africa with a view to regaining control of Togoland and the Kameruns and turn them back to Germany to whom they belonged before the First Great War. Free French forces are fully prepared to meet any attack, it is stated.

# ICELAND IN DANGER

LONDON-The British Broadcasting Corporation says that Iceland is in danger of Nazi attack. Troops, naval vessels and aircraft being concentrated at Narvik in Norway may be used for the purpose, it is suggested. The Parliament of Iceland last Friday dissolved the union with Denmark which has existed since 1918 when Iceland became a sovereign state after having been a Danish protectorate. The Danish King, as a result, is no longer King of Iceland. The move is made, it is explained, because of communication difficulties and not because Iceland is no longer loyal to King Christian.



## **QUIET IN ENGLAND**

LONDON-Some damage was caused by air raids in southwest and east England but, on the whole it was a quiet night. Some damage was done but casualties were not serious. The Royal Naval College and the Royal College of Surgeons are among buildings recently hit by bombs in London.
