NAZIS ARE WIPED OUT BY SOVIET

Moscow Claims Heavy Casualties Inflicted On Enemy-Atrocities On Peasants-London Opinion

SOVIET STRIKES BACK MOSCOW, July 16: (CP)- The Russian counter-offensive is continuing west of the Dneiper River and German forces have been shoved back even further than the nineteen miles already claimed, advices from the front declared today. Elsewhere, the Soviet communique said, the Red Army is holding on doggedly after furious overnight battles to stem the Nazi drives toward Leningrad and Moscow. The Russian air force also struck back for the third successive night at Ploesti, heart of the German-used Rumanian oil fields.

MOSCOW, July 16:-Large German forces, driving towards Moscow have been wiped out on the central front of the Russo-German war, a Soviet communique reported today. The Nazi drive towards Kiev on the south has been halted with heavy losses of German forces and equipment.



Fruit Divinity Fudge This candy is best with dried fruits. The dried fruits should be chopped or coarsely ground. 1 cup sugar

2 tablespoons corn syrup 1/2 cup water

cup egg whites (beaten stiff). 1-3 cup chopped or ground dried

1/4 cup chopped nuts (optional) Cook sugar, corn syrup and water 252 degrees F. or to a "light crack." Add syrup gradually to the stiffly beaten white of egg, beating the mixture until stiff. Add dried fruit and nuts, mix well and pour into greased or oiled pan to harden. This candy becomes hard so it should be consumed within a week after it is made.


