PAYMENT

Seeking \$34,000,000 From Provincial Government_Pattullo Says Claim Is Not Valid

VANCOUVER, March 13: (CP) -Premier T. D. Pattullo announced today that the Dominion government was requesting payment of provincial treasury bills totalling more than \$34,-000,000 held by the Dominion government.

Mr. Pattullo said that nearly \$25,000,000 of the total was for upemployment relief, adding "we do not recognize that the Dominion has a valid claim on the province in respect of these unemployment relief notes."

The balance covers advances for other purposes. The terms or method of repayment are not known here.
