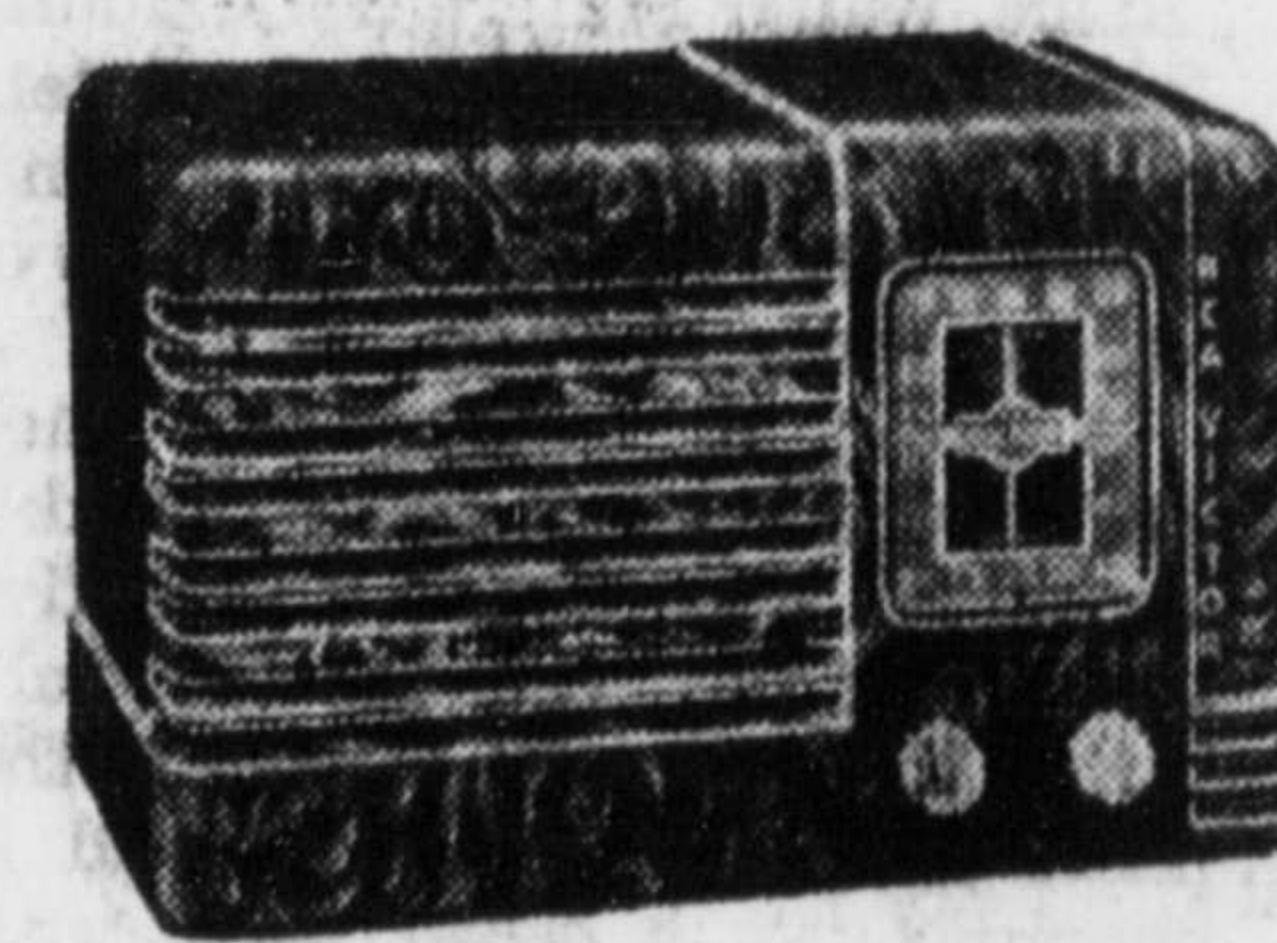

TOO WARM ON FARMS

SMITHERS, July 18.—The heat wave that has struck the whole Pacific Coast still maintains its peak in the Bulkley Valley with the temperature standing at from 90 to 100 degrees in the shade.

The farmers are all working on their hay but handicapped by the excessive heat which is hard on man and beast and work in the middle of the day has to be curtailed. Hay is cut in the morning ready to put up at night.
