AT has

We may or may not agree with the policy of voluntary instead of automatic observance of rationing measures but we do believe that the most of good Canadians will respect the ration limit which has been decreed by the government through the Wartime Prices and Trade Board. The reduction of Canada's sugar consumption is necessary to the prosecution of the war. Otherwise no ration would have been decreed. That is sufficient reason for Canadians to respect the decree and accordingly govern themselves instead of taking advantage of quite apparent means of evasion.

To use less sugar involves little enough of a sacrifice. Before the war is over it may be insignificant compared with other sacrifices we may be called upon to make.

That Canadians are responsive to appeals for voluntary rationing was indicated by the sharp curtailment in consumption of ham, bacon and other pork products which resulted from an appeal several months ago that Canadians east less of this type of food so that Britain might have adequate supply.

Canadians were glad to change their eating habits in regard to ham and bacon. No doubt they will as readily adjust themselves to the use of less sugar. For many, indeed, it may be beneficial to use less.
