The Japanese have turned their attention to the S omon Islands, lying as a glance at the map of Ocean shows, just to the east of New Guinea and northeast Australia. The strategy of this move is, of course, wards cutting off aid to Australia. Next might be a ticipated attacks on New Hebrides, possibly New Ca' donia or the Fijis, and ultimately New Zealand-unle of course, the enemy over-reach themselves and are, last, effectively stopped.

All of the moves now being made tend to furth encircle Australia and prevent aid being sent to the Cor monwealth. For the time being at least, the attenti of the enemy seems to be concentrated on Australia.

The problem is to get aid to Australia-and get there quickly. There is no gainsaying the fact that situation "down under" is becoming increasingly serior We may derive some consolation from the assurances those in high places, particularly in the United State that something is really being done to meet this cris and to carry the battle into the enemy's own camp.
