First Ballot Only Begins at Seven O'Clock This Morning---Clark Seems to Have It So Far Over Wilson---Roosevelt Reiterating Willingness to Withdraw---His Platform Outlined---Mayor Gaynor's Chrnces---Called Trump Card

Friday) balloting for the presidentiai nominee had only just commenced by the Democratic convention, prolonged demonstrations were held by the supporters of Champ Clark and Woodrow Wilson lasting over an hour and twenty-five minutes each. Nomination speeches, forcible and lengthy, took up th time from shortly after midnight. Baldwin and Underwood were also nominated.

# BASEBALL SCORES RUPERT'S FAVORITE BOXER WINS CHAMPIONSHIP BELT

Joe Bayley Outboxes Billy Allen at Bassano, After a Splendidly Sporting Fifteen-Round Contest---New Champion Lightweight Boxer of Canada Beats Former Holder of Belt by Power of Endurance Plus Splendid Skill With the Gloves

(Special to Daily News.. Bassano, June 27.-Joe Bayley, the Pacific coast lightweight champion, tonight, after fifteen rounds of fast fighting, wrested the lightweight championship of Canada from Billy Allen of Toronto before a great crowd that filled the arena to capacity.

When Referee Tommy Burns at the end of the scheduled number of rounds held up his arm for Bayley the decision was greeted with rounds of applause indicating the popularity of the verdict. The only knock down bout was in the last round, when Allen went to the mat for a count of nine. 

### SHORTCOMINGS OF CONVENTIONS.

The present Republican convention is doubtless the last which the party bosses will rule under present day methods. The party boss has been in control of conventions for many years. The people have revolted from his domination and have insisted upon state primaries in some places.

It is interesting to note that the battle at Chicago was mainly between delegates chosen by the bosses at party conventions and the delegates chosen at the primaries. The party bosses are in control now, but the will of the people must prevail eventually. In the next Republican convention without doubt the delegates nominated by primaries will be in the big majority.

The convention method is undemocratic. An unscrupulous United States president by the convention method could so fortify himslf in office as to make himself practically impregnable and could keep on getting conventions forever. Taft is not popular in the United States. If there had been nation wide primaries he would have no chance of election. Had there been no primaries at all he would have been chosen without difficulty. He is not a scientific manipulator or a politician. If he can fortify himself in office against the wishes of the people the power of the unscrupulous office holder seeking re-election would be almost without limit.

The convention system of selecting candidates across the line has fallen down everywhere. It gives the greatest opportunifies to the manipulator, the boss and the wire puller. Conditions in this country are somewhat different and the evils of the system that are so apparent across the line are not so apparent in Canada. However, the opportunity is here and it will be a matter of time only before the evils will be reproduced.—Calgary Albertan.






