### GREAT CONVOY TO INDIA

LONDON .- The largest convoy of reinforcements ever sent to India has arrived at eastern Indian ports. The number of troops and material, including tanks, was described officially as possibly the largest ever to leave England. At the same time the British reported Japanese troops, advancing in a threatening move toward India, had reached Homalin in Burma, only forty-five miles from the Indian frontier.

## TIRPITZ AND HIPPER HIT

LONDON-The German battleship Tirpitz and the heavy cruiser Admiral Hipper received several direct hits during the last Royal Air Force raid on Trondheim area, Norwegian sources reported today.

## SUBMARINES AT SYDNEY

SYDNEY-The submarines which the Japanese used in the attack on Sydney were somewhat larger than at first believed. One of the four which were destroyed has been raised. It was from 50 to 60 feet long and had accommodation for a crew of six.

## TAKING TOLL OF JAP SUBMARINES

MELBOURNE - Australian headquarters announce that Allied planes, guarding vital lanes in which war supplies are flowing to Australia, sank two more Japanese submarines and probably a third off the Australian east coast, making a total of six and possibly seven Japanese undersea raiders destroyed in the Australian theatre in the last five days.

## OFFENSIVE IS DEMANDED

CHUNGKING-High Chinese quarters declare that Japan is developing a knockout blow against China designed to end the Chinese war at any cost and simultaneously guarantee overland communication with occupied French Indo-China and adjacent countries. The press here is demanding a land, sea and air offensive against Japan-

VICTORIA, June 5 (CP).-The United States government is investigating the feasibility of building a railway from Prince George to Alaska, it was learned today, although no decision has been made regarding construction. This disclosure was made by Hon. R. W. Bruhn, minister of public works, after it was learned that Major J. L. Charles of the Royal Canadian Engineers would establish headquarters shortly at Prince George in connection with surveying of a route north to Finlay Forks and up the Rocky Mountain Trench to the Yukon.

Survey parties are reported working out of Selkirk, Yukon Territory.
