## WANTS TO SEE BOYS

Jimmy Andrews Sends Invitation From Greenock to Rupert Men.

Jimmy Andrews, formerly employed at the Prince Rupert dry dock and now a seven-day a week worker in the shipyard of the Clyde in Scotland, writes to his old friend, R. J. Keron of this city, saying that he often sees Canadian soldiers and sailors but he has not yet run across any from Prince Rupert. He would be glad to welcome any of them, Jimmy says, at his home at 17 Mearns Street, Greenock.

Jimmy describes having come through a blitz air raid in May when buildings all around his home were flattened out. "Indeed his own home was 'quite a mess,' to use Jimmy's words. He had a busy time on the roof himself putting out incendiaries. Jimmy receives the Daily News regularly and certainly appreciates it. Incidentally, he has missed getting only one bundle since the war began.

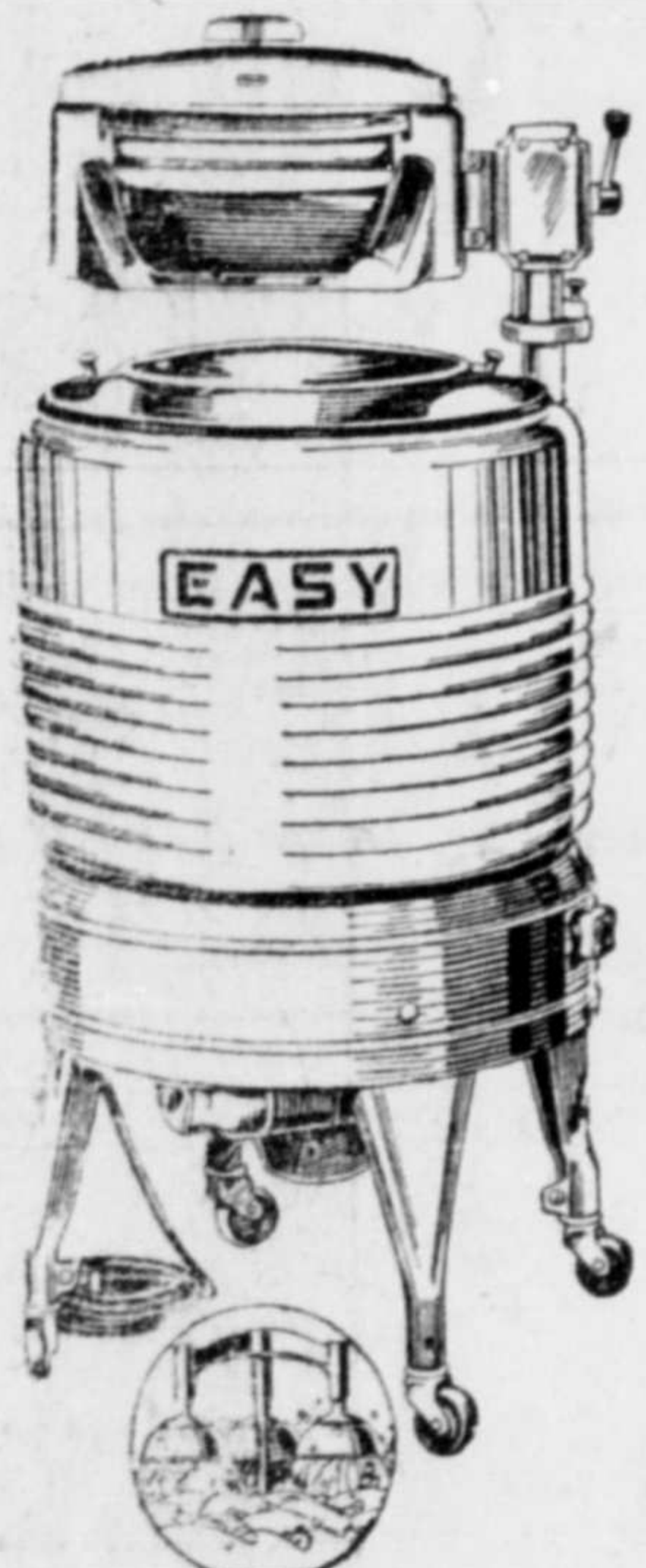

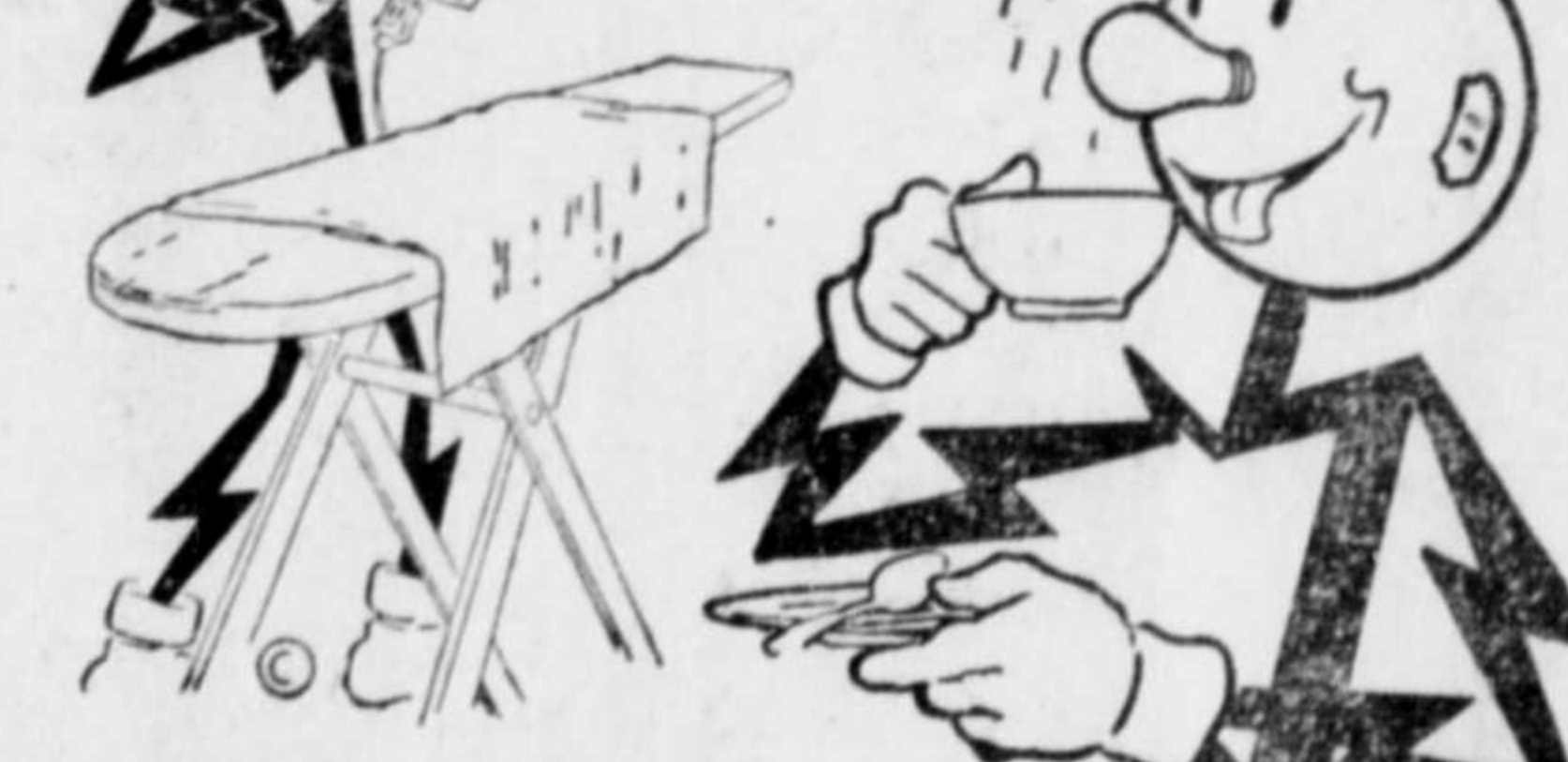
