Now is the dull time at Prince Rupert as far as fishing activities are concerned between the closing of such winter pursuits of herring seining and the opening of the halibut fishing and later the salmon fishing. April 16 has been officially confirmed by the International Fisheries Commission as the date for the commencement of the halibut fishing. However, the American and Canadian fleets have failed so far to get together in the matter of arranging voluntary curtailment and control measures with the result that, to date, there is complete uncertainty as to how the fishing is to be carried out. Unless something in the way of an agreement is reached suddenly, it looks like there will be no order to the thing at all and that it will be one mad scramble to haul in the fish as quickly as possible. What might be the almost disastrous result of this may be easily seen. Two of the most serious effects might be the exhaustion of the quotas, particularly that of the nearer in Area No. 2, within a few weeks and the demoralization of the market through glut of fish from disordered landings. The Prince Rupert fleet has been endeavoring to get together in formulating curtailment and control measures but claims it has been entirely unable to obtain any co-operation from the American fleet.

As far as salmon fishing prospects for the season are concerned, there is reason to expect a good run and a receptive market but nothing has yet been done in the way of price agreement for the year. It will be, as usual, towards the end of June before salmon gillnetting starts for the canneries. Spring will, however, see the trollers getting into action.

Canneries Opening Up
Having made her first round of the season at Skeena River canneries points with freight and some of the early workers in anticipation of the forthcoming summer's packing operations, Union steamer Cardena, Capt. John Boden, was considerably late in arriving at 1 o'clock this afternoon from the south. The vessel is sailing at 2:30 p.m. on her return to Vancouver and waypoints. Before coming in here, the Cardena called this morning at Claxton, Carlisle, Inverness, North Pacific, Sunnyside and Port Essington.

Indian Department's cruiser Naskeena made a trip to Port Simpson yesterday to bring in W. C. Warren of Vancouver, engineer for the Dominion Water Branch, who has been at Simpson for over a month superintending the making of repairs to the water system there and the putting in of a new reservoir. Mr. Warren is sailing this afternoon by the Cardena on his return to Vancouver.

Herring in spawn are now evidently abundant all the way between Port Simpson and Prince Rupert, it is reported. Unusually large numbers of seagulls are preying on them.

Ed Jenner Honored.
A pleasant event took place in the waiting room at the Canadian National Railways station on Tuesday afternoon of this week when a farewell presentation was made to Ed Jenner, for many years shed foreman on the local dock, who is leaving on superannuation next week. The presentation was made on behalf of the freight department staff by Lionel Holtby, its senior member. Suitable sentiments were expressed by Mr. Holtby in making the presentation and by Mr. Jenner in receiving it. Mr. Jenner, who is to make his future home at Sooke, Vancouver Island, is succeeded as shed foreman by Howard Hill.
