gium, Holland, Denmark and Norway have been robbed and looted of everything movable by the Germans, and the people of these countries are living under conditions of rationing which do not provide more than enough to sustain life. It will be the task of Britain, the United States and Canada and the South American republics within the community of the United Nations to provide the food without which the people of these ravaged lands will be unable to rebuild.

The existence of the immense stores of food which have been held by the peoples of the United Nations has not proved to be an inducement to the peoples of Axis countries to get out of the war, not up to the present. Probably this is because in the Axis-dominated countries the dictators have promised that they would soon control the world and the food would be captured and brought home. But as the course of the war has undergone a great change in the past six months, the dream of conquering the remaining free portion of the world and looting it of food must be fairly well dissipated by now. The end of the war and food in abundance must soon become a very attractive objective of all the peoples of Europe, including Germans and Italians. Abundant food for Sicily will help to get the message of hope to Italy.
