General Review of Allied Strategy is Under Way-British Foreign Secretary Expected to Visit Moscow ·

QUEBEC, Aug. 19 (CP)—A general review of Allied political strategy developed today when Rt. Hon. Anthony Eden, British Foreign Secretary, conferred with President Franklin D. Roosevelt and Prime Minister Winston Churchill to be joined later by United States Secretary of State Cordell Hull.

The Germans are moving troops into Italy in considerable strength, apparently intending to make a real fight for at least the northern end of the country, competent British sources said today.

LONDON, Aug. 19 (P)—Russian troops, striking across the Donets River Wednesday, captured Zmyev, 20 miles south of Kharkov, in an assault which killed 1,200 Germans and threatened to cut one of the last railways feeding that besieged and nearly surrounded Ukrainian base. Russians northwest and west of Kharkov captured more than 50 villages.


