### Meat Rationing

Meat rationing will start durin May. Details of the plan, includ ing charts showing the coupon values of each cut of meat, will be available shortly. The meat ration of approximately two pounds per week per person will include a certain percentage bone. All cuts to be rationed will be classified according to bone content and different amounts of each class may therefore be purchased.

### Armed Forces

Ration Cards are issued to members of the Armed Forces when they are on leave for five days, or more. They may be obtained at a Local Ration Board or Branch of the Ration Administration on presentation of leave pass or letter from a C.O. The value of
