

> LONDON, Nov. 10 (CP)- The Allies sank nearly five uboats weekly during the last three months and went further ahead of the undersea raiders by holding merchant shipping losses below that figure, the British and United States governments announced yesterday. Approximately sixty Nazi submarines were sent to the bottom in that period with many more probably sunk.

October was the second lowest month of the year for Allied ship losses at the hands of u-boats.
