Alarming statements made at the Prince Rupert Rotary Club luncheon yesterday in regard to fire hazard conditions in Prince Rupert are something to be taken seriously. These conditions are, of course, due largely to the mushroom growth of the city during the past couple of years with housing conditions badly overcrowded, services overtaxed and the water system inadequate to meet the new requirements.

In view of the war conditions and for other wellknown reasons, it is not possible to carry out the necessary improvements at this time and a good deal of work that would be required to permanently meet the situation. It is more important than ever these days to see that all fire precautions are observed and no undue chances taken. It may be literally said · that it would only take a small spark to start a major conflagration in Prince Rupert under existing conditions.




