## LITVINOFF RECALLED

WASHINGTON - Maxim Litvinoff has been removed as Soviet ambassador to the United States and will become vicecommissar of foreign affairs at Moscow. His successor is Andre Grumiko. There are various interpretations as to the motive for the removal of Litvinoff. One is that it might be an expression of displeasure of the Soviet over the failure of United States and Great Britain to open a second front. Another is that Litvinoff may be wanted in Moscow for important diplomatic discussions. Ivan Maisky, Russian ambassador to Britain, has also been recalled.

## CURTIN IS ENDORSED

Labor already has 45 or more seats while the Opposition is leading in 22. The government won all 19 seats in the Senate which were contested.

Kharkov, great industrial centre of the Ukraine, was last recaptured by the Russians in February and was lost again by them in March. It has changed hands four times in less than two years.

## Amendments to the Unemployment Insurance Act

E FOUR

Notice to Interested Employers and Employees

ITS 1943 Session, the Parliament of Canada amended the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1940. The effect of these amendments is to require that additional workers be covered under unemployment insurance.



On and after September 1st, 1943, employers must make contributions in respect of the following employees:

- **★**(1) ALL PERSONS engaged in employment hitherto insurable, regardless of the amount of earnings, who may be paid on an hourly rate, on a daily rate, on a weekly rate, or a piece rate (including a mileage rate).
- ★ (2) ALL EMPLOYEES paid on a monthly or annual salary basis, whose salary, including any cost of living bonus which may be received, does not exceed \$2,400 a year.

All employees, as above described, must pay their contributions as required by law.

The combined contribution for each employee earning \$26 or more a week will be in Class 7-63c a week.

To Employers: Obtain unemployment insurance books from the nearest local office of the Unemployment Insurance Commission as soon as possible, for employees above described who will become insurable on September 1st, 1943.

To Employees: It is in your interest to see that your employer makes contributions on your behalf from September 1st, 1943, if you become insurable through this Amendment.
