**LIFE in this Prince Rupert

The time when all hook-nosed witches looked over their stock of brooms, hob-goblins donned their sootiest suits, and children carved triangular-nosed faces in unsuspecting pumpkins, has come and gone for another year.

To most of us, it meant an evening of constant running to and from the door in answer to an anthem of "Hallowe'en Apples—Trick or Treat!"—and the following morning scooping garbage back into an overturned tin. Reminiscing on less modern days, we still may be thankful there are no small four-walled out-buildings to be turned "draughty-bottoms up!"

Twice, a decade and a half apart (fathers will brag to their sons!) a more energetic group went to work on King Edward School, raising a huge skull and cross-bones banner to the top of the flagpole, which at that time stood on the turret of the building. As a final touch, the pole was adequately greased, and the cord cut; hence the flag, of necessity, continued to flutter to the delight of the "saints" who had accomplished the feat.

Strangely enough, Hallowe'en and Saints are definitely related. The Hallowe'en of today is a far cry from the original established by the early Christian Fathers in commemoration of saints and martyrs, and held on November 1 as a great feast day. The eve, therefore, on October 31 was called All Hallow's E'en, the name derived from the old English word "halwe," or holy.

Prior to this time, the Romans held this feast in honor of Pomona, goddess of fruit trees. In Britain, the Druids celebrated a festival at the same time in honor of the sun god and in thanksgiving for harvest. When the people became Christian, their leaders wisely allowed them

THE BIBLE TRUTH

your faith should not stand in the wisdom but in the power of God" (Inst. Cor. 2:5), we like to draw attention to a few discrepancies in tradition and Truth.

Let us note that God does invite us to use our own reason together, saith the Lord.

NEW DIESEL LOCOMOTIVES

First of Order to be Delivered to C.N.R. Next Week

MONTREAL—The first of 10 new diesel-electric switcher locomotives being built by the General Motors Corporation for the Canadian National Railways will be delivered to the company next week, N. B. Walton, C.B.E., executive vice-president, announced here. Coming off the assembly line at the rate of one a day beginning Monday, the order is expected to be completed by November 15. Six similar powered engines were received recently from the American Locomotive Company for use on the Grand Trunk western line.

Waterfront Whiffs

Major Crab Fishing Industry Looms On Islands—Fishing For Herring Next Activity

Possibility that a major crab fishing industry may develop on the Queen Charlotte Islands, growing out of high prices being paid for the crustaceans, is arousing comment on the coast. Key to expansion of the industry, however, is the development of methods of shipping the crabs so that they will arrive at their destinations fresh and with their full natural flavor.

Methods of shipping are subject of experimentation by the Prince Rupert Fishermen's Co-operative at the present time. Results of the experiments also may have a result in widening the market for shrimps, of which there are numerous beds along the coast.

At present, due to lack of a standard method of preserving while in shipment. Crabs and shrimps enjoy only local demand. This may be widened, however, if trial shipments to the continental market now being made by the Co-op bear results. Various methods being tried are quick-freezing, packing in ice, freezing the meat separately.
