YORKTON, Sask. (P) - A pup named Pru, 16 Royal Canadian Air Force personnel and two yellow-colored aircraft today are engaged in Operation Duck-a project mapping out by air 6,500 square miles of the Riding Mountain National Park area in west-central Manitoba.

6,500-Square-Mile Area
