# Special Rights To Be Utilized When War Ends

By Adelaide Kerr

NFW YORK, Aug. 8 (9-"The war taught us women of Norwav-who were among the most politically privileged women in the world-that we did not use our rights well enough."

That comment comes from Else Margrete Roed of the Norwegian Information Service in New York, Miss Roed is qualified to speak for Norwegian women. She is a former editor of Norway's leading woman's magazine - We Ourselves and Our Home, a former underground worker and now is in the United States as an unofficial representative of Norway's

"Betfore the war," she said, "Norwegian women had gressed so far in the matter of Viking days, Norwegian women have been a vital force in the country. The men went to sea and the women remained ity for the home and the chilsovereign state to give women political rights. Norwegian women got the vote in 1907 and the right to hold state positions five

"But there we stopped. We were too lazy to go into politics. We shrugged our shoulders and said, 'Leave it to the men.' In the Norwegian Storting (parliament) of 150 members there women at any time. We did not use the rights we had well

"All the world knows what happened in Norway during the I do not mean to infer that women in the government could have prevented the war. just because they were women. But women always blame men war. And I say we cannot rightly blame them, when we were not in there helping them prevent it. If you want to enjoy the privileges of a democratic country, you must contribute to it."
