Social Hygiene Week . . .

8 Columns, 12 ems.

Heralded by a broadside of publicity appearing today in a special section of the Daily News sponsored by the Junior Section of the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce with the co-operation of public-spirited local business people, Social Hygiene Week will be observed in Prince Rupert next week, featuring a number of publicity activities designed to bring the people to a realization of the seriousness more particularly of the venereal disease situation and the necessity for effective action in connection therewith. To accomplish this, it is rightly felt that here is a matter which should be brought clearly and fully before all people with no cloaking of any of the relevant and realistic angles of the question.

The articles contained in the special section cover the social hygiene question from many angles and give information and hints that should prove of value to every citizen so that he or she may find it possible to join in the fight against the inroads of venereal disease in one way or another. Syphilis and gonorrhea are rated as saboteurs No. 1 not only in the exigencies of war when the best of every man and woman is required but also in the whole national life at all times. Venereal disease is the greatest factor towards decadence of a people. If there is anything any of us can do to combat the menace, it is our duty to do so. We hope that the publicity contained in this paper today will suggest to every citizen some means of joining in the campaign.

As has been said by others, the Junior Section of the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerc is to be congratulated on taking the lead in the campaign here—a campaign in which representatives of all walks of life should be enlisted.

Beachheads--and After . . .

Recapture of lost ground on the Anzio beachhead and Gen. Harold Alexander's reassurances that the situation is well in hand are welcome. But the whole development in that theatre accents the strength and resourcefulness of the enemy and places sobering emphasis on the need for unsparing effort to make the Second Front a success.

Several Allied calculations have been upset at Anzio. It is now disclosed that the bold maneuver was designed to cut German communications and seize Rome. But the enemy not only held on the Cassino line more firmly than expected, he moved strong forces from northern Italy and even from YugoSlavia to counter attack. British-American supplies have had to land without real port facilities and under constant threat of bombing. Time and again the balance has been turned on the beachhead only by using heavy bombers and naval guns.

The whole experience indicates that making a landing in Europe is only the beginning; any beachhead might be prepared to withstand the weight of unspecified power the enemy can concentrate from many points. Along the Channel he will have at least as good facilities for concentrated counter-attack as in Italy. But there is hope in the prospect that Allied supply lines "ill be shorter and their power to knock out German communications greater.



Empire Visits For Sea Cadets

LONDON, Mar. 11 (9) - After the war parties of sea cadets from Britain, the Dominions and Colonies will interchange so that There will remain the greater they may share each others training and holiday camps and build up the closer contacts so vital to the future of the Commonwealth, Admiral Sir Lionel Halsey, chairman of the Navy League, said here.

of proper rehabilitation institutions were among features contributing to juvenile delinquency and venereal disease. Dr. Knipe also deplored the failure of parents to insist on religious instruction of their children and their attendance at church services. Abuse of alcohol was another factor which was often involved in the contracting of venereal disease. Seventy-five percent of patients when asked where they contracted venereal disease said: "I don't know where I got it. I was tight." Dr. Knipe congratulated the Junior Chamber of Commerce on its courage in taking up the venereal disease campaign and wished it success in the effort.

After his address, Dr. Knipe answered a number of questions. There was never one hundred percent cure of syphilis, Dr. Knipe admitted. What was termed a cure took about a year a half ordinarily although there was a treatment which was said to effect a cure in twenty-six weeks. It might be said that there was only one way of getting syphilis. Cases of contracting the disease by indirect contact were very few. Of course, there was hereditary syphilis.

Eye ulcers were often but a manifestation of venereal disease elsewhere.

Lack of hospitalization facilities for venereal disease in Prince Rupert was mentioned by Dr. Knipe. Natives were probably the

worst carriers of venereal disease here, Dr. Knipe said. There would be little danger of spread of venereal disease in a public swimming pool for the water would be chlorinated. Nevertheless, Norton Youngs said, there would be no Indians allowed in the swimming pool at Prince Rupert if he had anything to do

with it. Sixty - five percent of the people who had syphilis did not know it.

"We know how to control venereal disease," said the doctor, finished motorship Suorva built old boy who is married to "but, unfortunately, we have not got around to it."

Dr. Knipe's address was followed by the showing of interesting moving pictures.

V. D. Sources In Arrested Persons

Twenty-four of Twenty-seven Women, in Local Jail, . Affected

During a specific period, 27 women who had been arrested on various charges, and had appeared in court in Prince Rupert, were all given physical examinations. Blood tests were taken and analysis for venereal diease were made.

In 21 of the women, the tests for gonorrhea were positive. In three of the remaining six, syphilis was present. And remarkably enough. few of the women realized that they were suffering from either.

JOHN DOE'S TRAGEDY

Fate of Yound Man Who Took Syphilis From Prostitute

John Doe's case is important because it provides a clear picture of the tragic and costly effects of venereal disease. Here

(2). His wife was infected innocently, thus adding a burden of personal suffering to the strain of caring for a hopeless invalid.

(3). His period of useful employment ended when he was only 38 years of age. As a skilled logger his services would have been invaluable today.

(4). He and his wife were supported entirely by public assistance for six years at a cost of not less than \$3,500. His wife continues to be a public charge. (5). His hospital costs were

paid by the taxpayers. These amounted to more than \$750. (6). There were no children from this union, thus contribut-

ing nothing to the future. (7). He acquired his infection from a prostitute. Had commercialized prostitution been suppressed at that time the chances are he might have avoided infection.

To summarize, this man suffered greatly; his wife also suffered; industry lost the services of a skilled worker, and the taxpayers footed an expensive bill.

Sure Way To

The man who wishes to keep free of syphilis and gonorrhea will shun prostitutes and "pick-

Anyone who becomes infected should see his doctor at once. Above all avoid the mostly and dangerous "quack." One should not treat himself. The hospitals and mental institutions see many persons who "knew what to do" The rate of sex delinquency or followed the advice of triends.

And lastly, no one should expose anyone else to infection.

SIX EDUCATIONAL PATHS

To the Control of Venereal Disease in British Columbia

Factual Information About Venereal Disease

Uninformed or misinformed persons do not recognize readily the dangers associated with syphillis and gonorrhoea. It is essential, therefore, that the facts be made known to them. This is being accomplished by the use of literature, lectures, films, radio, newspapers, and other educational methods. By such means it is hoped to create not only a better understanding of the facts about venereal disease, but a desire to assist in the solution of this prob-

The Diagnosis and Treatment of Venereal Disease

Without adequate diagnostic and treatment facilities it would be impossible to stamp out venereal disease. British Columbia has such facilities, through its private physicians and Provincial Government clinics. A continuous educational effort is required to make sure that these facilities are made known to and used by infected persons.

. Suppression of Commercialized Prostitution

Commercialized prostitution is the greatest reservoir of venereal disease. Because so much fallacy and misinformation has surrounded this vicious racket, it is understandable that some well-meaning citizens take the stand that prostitution should be "regulated" under "medical supervision." Although this plan seems logical, IT DOES NOT WORK IN PRACTICE. Public Health authorities, progressive law-enforcement agencies, private citizens and organizations who value the health and happiness of their communities, and the Criminal Code of Canada all demand that commercialized prostitution be suppressed vigorously. By educational means, the Provincial Board of Health seeks to extend this enlightened public opinion.

Premarital Blood Testing

The importance of routine premarital blood testing as a measure of mutual protection is gaining wide acceptance. While the discovery of syphilis by this means, before marriage, would be disquieting, it would be less serious than such a discovery after marriage. The further education of the public will create a sound attitude toward this important public health aid.

Prenatal Blood Testing

The detection and early treatment of syphilis in expectant mothers can prevent the tragic infection of babies in 95 per cent of all cases. It is imperative that this hopeful fact be widely publicized.

Abolition of Quackery

Only a physician is qualified to diagnose or treat a venereal infection. The "quack" (any unqualified person) who purports to diagnose, treat, or cure syphilis or gonorrhoea does so illegally and with complete disregard for the welfare of his "patient." Through education, this form of exploitation will be more easily recognized and avoided.

Few Prince Rupert persons are aware of the existence at the Prince Rupert Health Unit of a well-equipped and efficienly operated clinic for the diagnosis and treatment of

Of importance, too, is the fact that the clinic strives to syphilis. His injury had started hold the personal touch with the patients and the service rendered with utmost privacy and confidence.

The rooms have been so arranged that no patient sees another, and the entrances are so arranged that there is little possibility of the general public noticing a patron entering or leaving.

The clinic contains shelves of medicine and equipment. Modern surgical instruments are used, (By Reg. S. Davis, Official Ediand a sterilizer stands ready for ing constantly to reduce industrial instant operation. There is an air of sanitation without the usual medicinal odor about the place.

It is in this clinic that literally thousands of treatments have already been made, in the short time the place has been in operation. Started in June, when Dr. R. G.

Knipe, and his predecessor, Dr. MacDonald, urged on the provincial government its need, the clinic has been an instant success. In August of last year, Dr. D. E. H. Cloveland, acting director of the venereal branch, Division of the Department of Public Health made a trip to the city and approved the undertaking. Since then, two clinics a week have been held.

Persons believing themselves infected, or wishing to make sure. for their own and others' sake, are advised to see their family physician or the Public Health Unit for a blood test and take advantage of the service that can be rendered

More Births Out Of Wedlock

Dread Scourge Without Benefit of Clergy Quite

> TORONTO, Mar. 11- Keeping company with rising statistics n venereal disease and delinquency. borths out of wedlock reached a new record in Canada during 1942. according to figures released by the Department of Pensions and National Health.

Illegitimate births totalled 10,-952, in 1942, as compared with 10,-101 in 1941 and 6.121 in 1926. The yearly total has grown steadily since 1926. The ratio of illegitimate births to all live births was slightly lower last year than in the preceding six years. In 1926, the ratio was 2.63 per cent of all live births. Last year it was 38.

The relationship between disease and delinquency was recognized last fall at the Wartime Conference of the American Public Health Association, where sessions of the section on health education were devoted to discussion of means to prevent delinquency through the media of educational and community resources.
