



### Seeds Need Your Help in Breaking Through to Sun

Even experienced gardeners, sowing top grade seed, do not always "get a catch," as the farmers say. Something may happen to prevent the seeds from coming up; cold weather may delay germination or fungi destroy them; and a crust may form on the soil above them which they cannot penetrate.

By dusting the seed with a disinfectant, the moulds and fungi may be prevented; and this is especially advisable in
