



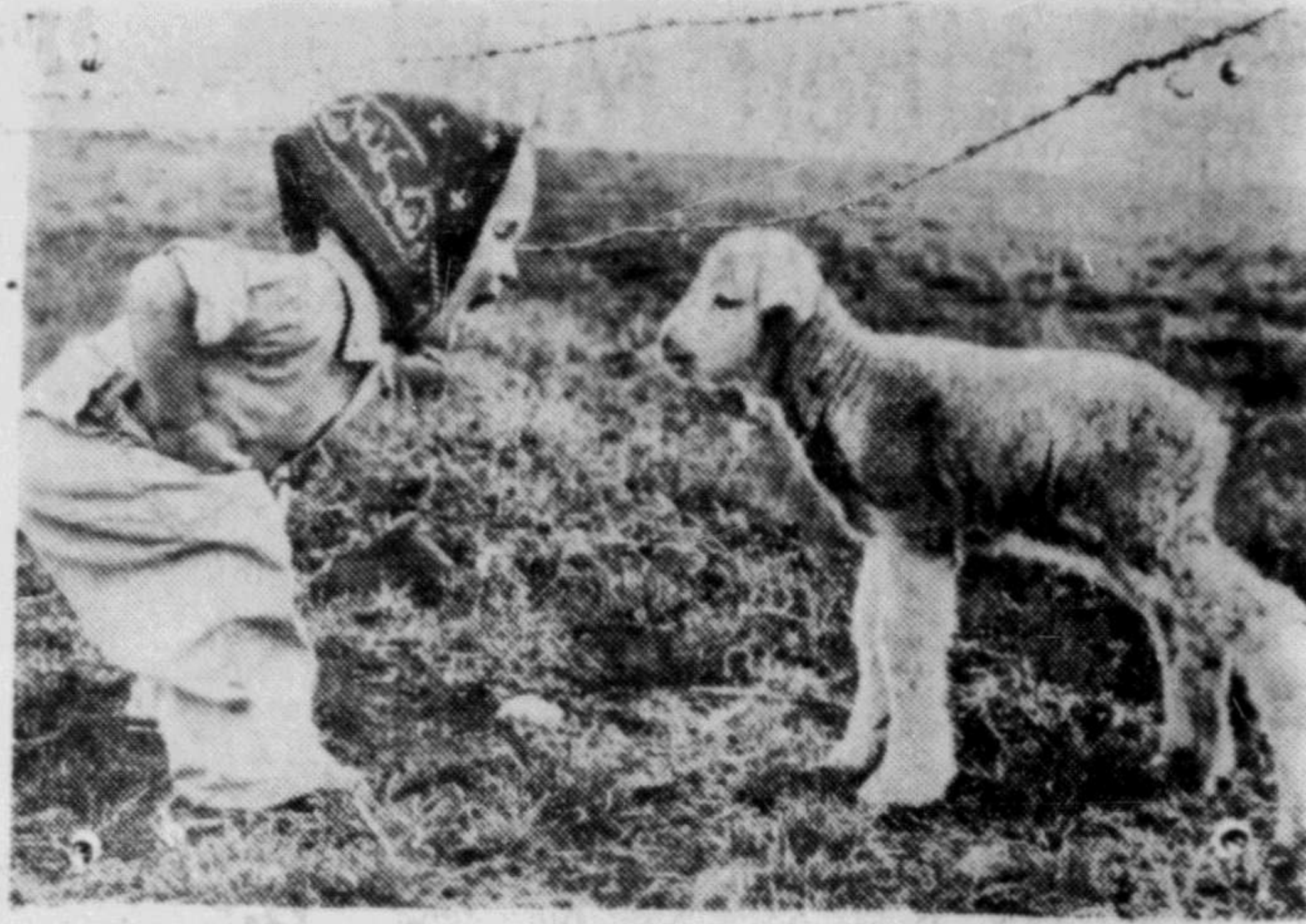

# Reflects . . . . . . and Reminisces

It is possible to follow the past into these long cold and silent questions, the member for Skeena is performing a welcome service, and doing it right at headquarters.

British Columbia's water power for industrial, farming or settlement purposes can still be made use of to a large extent. This is an immense province with thousands of waterfalls and swift streams and all of them possessing energy that keeps going to waste. And it's been like that for countless years. British Columbia—at least the northern part—was barely explored a few generations ago.

Manitoba, says G. D. Weaver, Liberal member for Churchill, should be rated as one of Canada's maritime provinces because she has a coast almost equal to that of British Columbia. He has urged this, on the House of Commons. It sounds like an insult to the balmy and beautiful west coast. Who ever heard of anyone moving to the chill and distant shores of Hudson Bay to enjoy a retired life? It may be correct to call Manitoba a maritime province, but somehow, it takes an effort.

## Report On Groundhog

New and Comprehensive Document Being Prepared By Geological Survey

Following field work in 1948 by A. F. Buckham and B. A. Latour, a complete report, with illustrations, on the Groundhog coal field in north-central British Columbia has been prepared and will be published by the Geological Survey of Canada, according to information which has been obtained at Ottawa by E. T. Applewhite, M.P. for Skeena.

Dr. W. A. Bell, acting chief of the Geological Survey, has advised Mr. Applewhite that "the report brings under one cover essentially all obtainable, authentic, significant information on this coalfield since its recognition as such in the late years of the last century. The authors deal carefully with the location, means of access and history of the coalfield, its physical features, and with what is known of its geology. A detailed description is then given of all the known occurrences of coal, accompanied by a table listing the results of one hundred and eight coal analyses. The report includes a full bibliography of the coalfield, and includes an appendix giving a detailed description of trails leading into it. In short, the report is intended to be an adequate repository of all useful information on the Groundhog Coalfield to the end of 1948.

Field work was continued this year in the Groundhog coalfield under the direction of Dr. J. E. Muller of the Geological Survey. In spite of an exceptionally wet season, an attempt was begun to secure a more detailed idea of the structure and succession of the coal measures across the coalfield in the vicinity of the great

number of known occurrences of coal. The results of this work are not yet prepared for publication, and further field work may be required before any worthwhile information can be added to what is already known and in process of being published.

that huge geological formation are known. This constitutes a challenge to exploration engineers and geologists.

**MORE SCIENCE NEEDED**  
"There is a growing need for more scientific methods of prospecting," he said. "We must develop methods which will give us an idea of the underlying rock in areas covered by muskeg and heavy overburden."

Illustrating the chances against any property being brought into production on a paying basis, Mr. Moore declared that records of Ontario mines show that only one out of every 480 arrives at a state where it shows a bare operating profit and only one out of 1,500 develops into a genuinely paying producer.

"The initial cost of bringing a mine into production is about \$5,000 for each ton of ore, so you can understand that heavy capital expenditures are involved. It is really risk capital."

Since scientific prospecting methods and large expenditures are necessary, development companies look favorably only on prospects which indicated highly concentrated ore bodies of large size. Development plans often hinge on reports of engineers and geologists, and often the reports of different experts differ.

"Consolidated Mining and Smelting chooses to finance its properties by itself, although some companies allow public participation by selling shares," he said. "Often a prospector with a likely claim will go to a broker and a mine will be financed completely by public subscription to its stocks."

Mr. Moore told of a lead-zinc property in northern Alberta which had been known to exist for more than half a century, but which is now being developed by Consolidated and associated companies only after scientific exploration indicated an economic
