### SERVING Q.C. ISLANDS

THE PRESENT operating company wrests with the problem of providing the Queen Charlotte Islands with a reasonable and decent steamship service compatible with the financial returns to be derived therefrom, another transportation headache develops. Possibly the solution lies in the utilization of the convenient port of attempted for so many years, to tag the Islands selection. directly on to faraway Vancouver instead of nearby Prince Rupert. The big loss in the present transportation set-up for the Islands, it is quite obvious, is that long haul from Vancouver to the Islands which could be eliminated by operating a feeder service out of Prince Rupert to connect with or continue from direct runs between Vancouver and Prince Rupert through the "Inside Passage." A reasonable suggestion that is being heard is that a ship running between Vancouver and Prince Rupert could extend the run westward to the Islands and back to Prince Rupert instead of the present-circuitous operation northward and southward to the Islands between Vancouver and Prince Rupert. Alternatively a suitable vessel could be based at Prince Rupert, the only difficulty to which would be the transferring of goods coming from Vancouver to the Islands and destined in the reverse. By either means, however, a better service would be directly available to the Islands governed by the traffic operating. For instance a weekly direct service out of this port would be readily possible. Possibly the best compromise arrangement would be the continuation of a direct Vancouver-Prince Rupert vessel out of here to the Islands and back, making all points each voyage. That would eliminate the long and sometimes slim revenue voyage between Vancouver and Prince Rupert via the Islands, would provide a better service for the Islands and would keep Prince Rupert and Vancouver both happy.

WINNIPEG- Owing to the late, backward spring in western Canada, land operations have been almost completely tied up. Only a few scattered reports of farmers working in the fields have been received from territory adjacent to the C.N.R., in the whole western region, such isolated instances being in southern Manitoba and in the lighter, drier areas in Saskatchewan, according to the first weekly crop report of the De-1 LONDON partment of Agriculture of the
