



Bad Food Habits

DRESENT DAY food habits are causing the medical profession much concern, states the Public Health Bulletin, publication of the Toronto Department of Public Health,

"Both adults and children are eating far too much of the more expensive rich sweet foods-cakes, pastries, candies, soft drinks, etc.," says the Bulletin. "These are the foods which supply energy only, which lead to overweight and enter into the serious modern dental picture as well. They are expensive in more ways than one.

"On the other hand, the cheaper, healthier and more nutritious foods, milk, the whole grain cereals, whole wheat bread, fruits and vegetables, etc., that supply, as well as energy, bone building and health materials, are neglected.

The Bulletin states that such necessities are neglected by children often because the parents do not care for them sufficiently. Bad food habits of parents as a rule are an influence on the eating habits of the children because foods that parents accepted are usually accepted by the family. Parents' likes and dislikes frequently influence the likes and dislikes of children, because children are great imitators.

"When parents decide to eat and to enjoy the right foods, thus setting the example for their children, they not only do themselves a good turn but are shaping the dividends which come from a healthy well-nourished family."

Discussing overweight, the Bulletin says that medical authorities ascribe this condition almost invariably to overeating, especially to the overeating of wrong foods, and very seldomly to glandular disturbance.

"They further assure us that overweight enters very definitely into the current picture of heart conditions, high blood pressure, diabetes, etc."




A dress from B.C. Hemlock

A rapidly growing addition to British Columbia's Pulp and Paper Industry is the production of rayon pulp.

Over 120,000 tons of this high-grade pulp was exported last year to rayon mills in the United States, Great Britain and the Orient. These mills will convert the pulp into wood silk, in the form of rayon filaments, yarns, plastics, cellophane, etc. Significantly, rayon yarns are used in two thirds of all women's clothes made in the United States.

Rayon pulp is highly purified cellulose manu. factured from tiny fibres of suitable trees. This process requires complex procedures and expensive machinery.
