

This map gives some idea of the extent of the plan which would give the city a population of roughly 1,000,000 as against its present 673,000 and an area of 113,000 acres compared w th 26,904. Ten complete communities and portions of two others would become part of Toronto. Long Branch, New Toronto, Mimico and Swansea on the west; Weston, York Township, North York Township and Forest Hill Village on the north; and Leaside and East York Township on the cast would be no more. Approximately two-thirds of the area and 90 percent of the population of Etob icoke Township on the west and one-third the area and two thirds of the population of Scarboro Township in the east would be swallowed up. This map shows these various districts with the ir areas and population to be included in the amalgamated city. The shaded area is Toronto as it is today.

ISCUSSING THE STATEMENT by a high of-U ficer of the Alaska defence council that Alaska is in no danger of a ground attack, the Ketchikan Chronicle says that such a statement might bear some analyzing. 'No part of the world except western Europe is in much danger of a ground invasion, and the people of today do not fear that sort of attack nearly so much as they fear death from the remarks regarding unemploy-

"Infantrymen and amphibious operations together could and would be mighty successful against it might be Alaska, however, much more so than counter-attacks by our own forces could be to the Siberian coast line leading to practically nothing for many miles whereas from Alaska, invading planes could bomb vital targets in the northwestern and midwestern states.

"Southeastern Alaska is the jugular vein to interior Alaska's vital air bases and army bases, and infantrymen could cut this vein by disembarking from transports or submarines and seizing key points along the inside passage. They could also seize almost a dozen airfields to be turned agains the states.

"So it is hardly reassuring to hear an officer of the Alaska command declare that Alaska is safe from ground invasion. Holding forces, whether they came by air, sea or dog team, could do a lot of harm in Alaska because it has so few alternative transportation routes and so much rough terrain and rough weather in which the invaders would have to be dislodged. Remember Attu and Kiska?"
