As Communists Pour Reinforcements Into Fight To Stay Advance

TOKYO-While North Korea was pouring in reinforcements from north and west. United States Marines, having crossed the Han River, neared the heart ofSeoul today after having concentrated on the capital city following their new invasion last Friday at Inchon. The Americans were closing in from two sidesone force from the northwest, the other from the southwest.

The city is not yielding without stubborn resistance. The United Nations forces will now consolidate their recaptured grounds to carry on further ad-

vances towards the thirty-eighth

parallel. There is every indication, however, that they will meet with increased resistance from the reinforced North Korean defensvie forces.

The Red reinforcements are coming from Manchuria but whether they are Chinese Communists or Red-trained Koreans is uncertain. As the Marines smashed on

today, they were being slowed down and, at some points halted, by the big North Korcan column rolling down from Russian-dominated Manchuria to fight for the capital. The armored column of doubt-

ful nationality consisted of forty tanks and 200 other vehicles from Red China's Yalu River frontier in Manchuria. United States intelligence officers were endeavoring to determine its

Many Red Koreans have \*\*\*\*\*\* June 25 invasion across Parallel 38 were seasoned with Communist China's Monchurian armies. Their heavy equipment and planes were all of Russian manufacture.

The American Marines and their tanks entered Seoul from the northwest at 6 p.m. Wednesday while another column moved in from the west after seizing Seoul's airfield across the Han River.

Korean Red troops are converging on Seoul from several 1/2 old Allied southeast beachhead the old Allied southeast beachhead perimeter.

A big battle for Seoul seems to be shaping up, a battle of deep significance if the force from Manchuria should turn out to be non-Korean in manpower. This mysterous force may already have crossed the 38th parallel, dividing North and South Korea and only thirty miles

north of Seoul. British troops in southeast Korea late today moved across the Naktong River and joined American and South Korean forces pushing in to Kumchow. RIOTING IN SEOUL

A South Korean official, quoted by Pusan radio, said today that "tens of thousands of anti-Communist workers" are rioting in Seoul. The radio said that military law has been imposed in the city.





It runs from Prince George. north via Summit Lake to Fort McLeod and east through Pine Pass to Dawson Creek. Between Prince George and Vancouver the Cariboo Highway would be used by trucks and other traffic.

Seattle and other coastal points already forecast that its use for Alaska Highway freighting will mean a saving of two days as compared with the Edmonton route.

When completed an exclusive franchise for passenger and freighting traffic is to be held by the Pacific and Great Eastern Railway company, which is government-operated.
