

Russian Professions

T WOULD be a grand thing, indeed, if we could accept the professions which have been made during the last few days by the leaders at the Kremlin that they are sincerely out for world peace with no strings attached. We could even believe, as Molotov reiterated at the week-end, that there is room in the world for both capitalism and communism. But Moscow's disruptive and unreasonable actions to date have not harmonized with their occasional professions of high desire for peace and harmony and live and let live.

Snarling, as they make their peace gestures. that United States and Great Britain are not sincere and are really warmongering do not promote the setting and the atmosphere for real peace dealing. Nor does petulant and intolerant walking away from proposels other than their own help us to see good

We all earnestly hope to deal with Russia in friendliness and co-operation but we must have more than the odd profession of peace desire from the Kremlin. It reminds us too much of similar professions from a man called Hitler.

BATTLE FOR MINDS

THE MASTERS of the Kremlin are experts in the war for people's minds. Witness the successes of Communism in the Far East and the continuing cold war of nerves in Europe if not in the Americas.

Only inconsequential shots are fired as Communism rolls on in the cold war. They are of ap- which would be involved shou parently little importance to the democracies and nothing more is done about them other than formal protests in the halls of the United Nations. At these the Russian diplomats only smirk because the swallowing of another country's severeignty has occurred from within and not from ostentatious use of Russian might. Eventual domination of the world by the Russian brand of imperialism would appear to be the long range aim with possible temporary lapses in the cold war.

Meanwhile the Communists, in the battle for themselves is what disposition one of his periodical trips to the human mind, never stop, as Dr. William R. Russell president of the Teachers' College at Columbia University, recently said, emphasizing examples of discrimination, intolerance, poverty, ill-health and unemployment on the North American continent. For this reason the battles for human minds in the schools, in the universities and in the community at large must be intensified.

The fact is that democracy, far behind in the battle for minds, has been woefully slow in documenting and emphasizing the record of liberty and laying it before the people so that they might realize the well-being which free-society has given them and which might be replaced by the regimentation of the slave state should ultimate world victory come for Moscow in the battle for human minds.
