"Mister Stoop," a football handicapper of more than ordinary renown in Montreal, looked at Alouettes' just-vanished football season and nominated the Als his winter-book favorites for next year's Dominion championship. Today the 1948 championship is being settled between Ottawa Roughriders and Calgary Stampeders. "Allowing an 'if' or two I don't see how they can miss," said Joe Lamont, a footyish, bent-framed man who enjoys his nickname, knowing that players and football fans use it strictly with affection. "One of the big questions is whether these fellows stick and play together next season," Joey went on. "Give us Virgil Wagner and Herb Trawkey again, along with about six other of this year's team. Then watch Alouettes."

A hockey accident put Joey out of sports competition 20-odd years ago and, since he can't play games any more, he does the next best thing. He watches all he can. Officially he is the Montreal Big Four time-keeper and the Alouettes' scorer. He is also a timekeeper with the Eastern Division of the Canadian Canoe Association. Joe was a member of the "Pony Express" team from Montreal's Grand Trunk Boating Club which captured the half-mile war canoe Dominion championship honors about two decades ago. And he was playing hockey, at 126 pounds, with a railway team in 1928 when he hurt his hip. Six months later poison set in, caused the ligaments to tighten, forcing a forward curvature of the vertebrae.

He swims and bowls and hopes that exercise may help straighten his body. Between times he'll discourse on any and all plays with the least encouragement at all.

Joe flubbed a bit when he called Alouettes to beat Ottawa in the Big Four play-offs but like every good handicapper he left himself a way out. "I said Als would do it in the last game if they got going in the first quarter," recalled Mister Stoop. "Well, they didn't get going until the game was nearly over. At that, in those dying minutes, they must have scared those Ottawa fans nearly to pieces."

LINK WITH EARLY DAYS

Alex Comadina Passes Away After Week's Illness

Another link with the early days of Prince Rupert was severed last night with the death of Alex Comadina who, following his arrival in 1911, helped with the construction of the Grand Trunk Pacific yards and later was for more than 20 years a civic employee.

Mr. Comadina passed away in hospital after being stricken a week ago.

Born at Lrsnik, Yugoslavia, 66 years ago, Mr. Comadina came to the United States in 1906, settling at St. Louis, Missouri. Two years later, he returned to his native land to claim his bride. Shortly afterward, he came to Ontario where he engaged in railroad construction until 1910.

That year he went to Vancouver and then in 1911 he settled in Prince Rupert where he took employment as a powderman during the vast blasting enterprise which created the railroad yards here.

Later, he worked at Rocher de Boule mine near Hazelton and at the Dolly Varden mine near Alice Arm. Before taking employment with the city waterworks department in 1926, he was employed at the Premier mine, near Stewart.

Mr. Comadina worked with

the city waterworks until four years ago when he transferred to another department. He was on the job a week ago when he was stricken with the only illness of his lifetime.

Surviving are his wife, who is in hospital, three sons, Michael, of Dawson City, John and Frank, both of Prince Rupert, and two daughters, Mrs. G. P. (Mary) Lyons, and Mrs. W. A. (Agnes) Pierce, also of this city.

One brother, Peter, survives him in Yugoslavia. Another brother, Paul, died recently at Gallup, New Mexico.

Funeral arrangements will be announced later.

Regarding a certificate of life expectancy (of the system) the proposed bond issue was of the serial bond type over a maximum period of 20 years. This, naturally, determined the basic average life expectancy of the system.

"It also was included in the proposed bylaw that the necessary procedure and certification would be attested by a recognized engineer."
Regarding the "special type of bylaw" which Mr. Bracewell said would be required because of the inability of the provincial government to allow the loan to be secured by pleading "rates and charges," Mr. Black said that Mr. Bracewell's statement itself needed clarification.
"In interviewing Mr. Bracewell, your committee felt that this was one of the strongest points in favor of making the project self-liquidating and Mr. Bracewell appeared to approve of the suggestion and offered no suggestions."

The Jews claim the desert under 1947 General Assembly partition of boundaries.
