Now You Can Test

With the great growth of shareholder-owned corporations and with the increase in company size, the practice of businessmen and their employees taking no active part in politics has become more widespread—and more dangerous.

Like 'em or not, party politics are the way democracy is run, and democracy we are trying to maintain. But with the executive group-the people of responsibility and experience of affairsrefusing to co-operate in the operation of our political institutions, our system is gravely jeopardized.

Certainly other groups are extremely active in party politics.

The Denver test found that 80 percent of organized labor was registered for voting; and affiliated with a party, hence able to have some influence on the choice of candidates. It revealed too that nearly every old-age pensioner is registered, affiliated and active in party affairs.

Businessmen should, in the national interest, re-examine their policies in this regard.
