Nationalist Warship Swings Into Action

Communists Repulsed and Slain While Attacking Tientsin's Port City-Chiang Forces More Hopeful

NANKING (CP)—A Nationalist warship at Tangku, isolated Tientsin's port city, drove off attacking Communists today, killing 1500, government sources said. Meanwhile an Associated Press correspondent at Peiping said many small Red attacks on the outskirts of Tientsin had been repulsed. Last night alone 800 were killed or more commenced and the second seco wounded and the Communists

were inactive today.

A.P. quoted General Futso-Yi WOULD SUE as saying that the Reds had repulsed almost every North China FOR PEACE attack. He said the Communists dared not attack Peiping directly because they know it is too strongly fortified. Two million inhabitants would support the

defenders, Fu said. The correspondent added that whether these residents would actually show their support, is another matter. He considers that they want peace above all.



THE SALE of margarine is permitted in Canada at present price levels it would be possible for families to purchase one pound of margarine and two quarts of milk for the price of one pound of butter, the Chemical Institute of Canada says. Such a substitution would help to improve the nutition of many Canadian families.

It is the opinion of the Chemical Institute that claims which have been made against margarine on the basis of inferior nutritive value have been shown to be without scientific foundation. Margarine has been in general use in Great Britain, in the U.S.A., and in other countries for many years without any demonstrable harmful effects.

"There is a very real situation with regard to oleomargarine from the viewpoint of practical nutrition," says a statement by the Institute. The cost of food is an important factor in determining food use. If people have difficulty in purchasing adequate amounts of the foods necessary for health, there can be only one result. With food costs at present levels, low-income families have serious trouble in obtaining an adequate supply of food. Butter is used principally in Canada to make bread palatable and most Canadians will not eat bread without butter or a similar spread. Bread is, and must be, a staple and major item in the food intakes of low-income families. For such families the use of butter at present prices is a factor inimical to adequate nutrition. Availability of margarine at about one-half the price of butter would be of considerable assistance to a great many Canadians. At present price levels it would be possible for families to purchase one pound of margarine and two quarts of milk for the price of one pound of butter. Such a substitution would help to improve the nutrition of many Canadian families."

FEWER DELINQUENTS

CEDERAL STATISTICS show there were fewer juvenile delinquents before the courts of Canada last year than at any time since 1924. While the problem is still unsolved, this statement is neverthless encouraging.

Convictions have been dropping. They fell from 7,956 in 1946, to 7,545 last year-not a great deal, it is true, but in the right direction.

EXPIATE THEIR CRIMES

EADING AS WELL as obscure war criminals are being punished without haste and only after fullest realization that there was no other course to follow if the ends of justice-were to be served.

Had those who were foremost in becoming directly responsible for monstrous crimes been shown mercy, it would have been betrayal. The weak and helpless would have perished, their fate not followed by the retribution so greatly justified.

The Second Great War was blackened by atrocities, surpassing in sheer terror and lust anything heard of in history.

Every foul act had its author. Many of these held civilian authority, and did not hesitate to use it under circumstances utterly base and cruel.

The mills of the Gods grind on. There is something inexorable about it. Without passion, but with a certainty like fate itself, the law, no matter where, seeks and finds.
